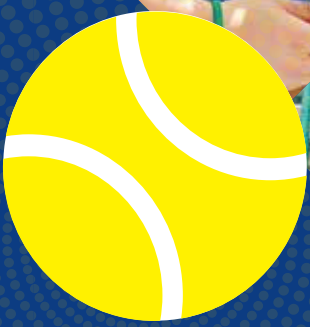

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am delighted to confirm that at the beginning of this year, Nissin Foods not only signed a 3-year extension to continue as the title sponsor of our three annual flagship junior events – Hong Kong National Junior Championships, Junior Series, and Junior Novice – they will also now collaborate with us as HKTA's official Youth Development Partner to help further the growth of our sport.

In addition, EFG Young Athletes Foundation and HKTA have agreed to jointly pledge a total of HKD 3 million over the next three years for the newly created EFG HKTA Tour Team to provide touring players with a travelling physio, and Eudice Chong and Cody Wong were selected as the initial beneficiaries of this funding.

Our players notched some fantastic results away from home in 2019, most notably with Eudice Chong and Maggie Ng medalling for Hong Kong in the women's tennis events for the first time at the World University Games with a bronze in the doubles. Eudice then captured a historic first medal in singles with a second bronze and, in the process, became the only tennis player from Hong Kong to medal twice at the same Universiade. Meanwhile, on the pro circuit, Eudice set another precedent by winning six US\$ 25,000 women's doubles titles from ten finals, while attaining career-high WTA Rankings of No. 394 in singles and No. 173 in doubles.

At the 2nd National Youth Games in Shanxi, our under-16 athletes – Marvin Lee, Kelly Leung, Tim Gauntlett, Sheena Masuda, Johnny Lee, and Oscar Wai – produced a record haul of a gold, two silvers, and two bronzes in mixed doubles, men's doubles, and women's doubles. It was a big improvement from our lone bronze medal in women's doubles at the inaugural event in 2015.

The Junior Davis Cup team comprising Coleman Wong, Tim Gauntlett, Oscar Wai, and Stephan Ehritt (Captain) secured Hong Kong's finest ever result by placing 8th at this year's World Finals held in Florida. The previous high was 10th place, which was achieved twice in 2001 and 2010, respectively. The under-16 team had done exceptionally well earlier to finish second in Asia/Oceania Qualifying back in April.

Cody Wong reached a career-high ITF Junior World Ranking of No. 23 earlier this year and gained direct acceptance into the main draw at all four Junior Grand Slams in 2019. At the Australian Open, she was seeded No. 1 in girls' doubles. At Roland Garros, she was a quarterfinalist in girls' doubles. At Wimbledon, she became the first player to advance to the last sixteen or beyond in girls' singles since Patricia Hy finished runner-up in 1983. A fortnight later, she successfully defended her Grade 1 title by winning the Zhong Tian Cup in Nanjing. Then, at the US Open, she became the first junior from Hong Kong to reach the girls' doubles semifinals. The following month, she beat four WTA-ranked players to capture her maiden US\$ 15,000 women's singles title and earned her first WTA Ranking. The 17-year-old will head into 2020 with a measure of optimism.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust granted a HK\$ 27.88 million, three-year extension to continue its financial support of the Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme, providing free training and equipment to primary school students (Tennis Rocks), students with special educational needs (Special Tennis Rocks), PE teachers (Teach the Teachers Tennis), and retirees & seniors (Senior Tennis Rocks). The purpose of the program is to promote tennis using a more proactive approach, driving grassroots development, and making tennis more accessible to the community. Since the programme's inception in 2016, the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust has committed nearly HK\$ 49 million to the HKTA with the number of beneficiaries reaching close to 6,000 thus far.

With the aim to establish a sustainable wheelchair tennis program to provide disabled children and adults with opportunities to enjoy an active and rewarding life, HKTA made successful grant applications to the ITF's Wheelchair Tennis Development Fund (WTDF) to provide subsidies for rackets and equipment expenses. We conducted our first-ever wheelchair tennis trial in June 2019 with regular training having started in August. Our first two wheelchair tennis players will receive grant support to compete in the Taipei Open in November.

The first training sessions for individuals from the Hong Kong Down Syndrome Association patients started in April at Chai Wan Park Tennis Courts with an initial group of 10 participants aged 25-35. Additional sessions were completed in June

and more will be offered under the Jockey Club Special Tennis Rocks Programme in due course.

For the first time, training for NTS (Futures) was rolled out in Tuen Mun at both Tang Shiu Kin Sports Ground (TM) and Wu Shan Tennis Courts (WS) to cater for the expanding Western New Territories market and to facilitate the participation of players residing in the area. Leo Liu, our former KT head coach, was assigned the task of overseeing the development of this regional center.

We also submitted Kowloon Tsai for National Training Center (NTC) status with the ITF, as NTC status recognizes excellence in both coaching and program development, including administrative staff, in the evaluation process. Pending approval, it will affirm HKTA as a front-runner in player development in Asia and thus benefitting our collaborations with other tennis bodies, as well as players, in the region.

The week-long Road to Wimbledon event was held on grasscourts for the first time this year, courtesy of HKCC and KCC, and consisted of a qualifying tournament for under-14 boys and girls, workshops and clinics for local coaches, as well as fun day events for the club members. The All England Club brought over Jeremy Bates, Lucie Ahl, and Jamie Delgado (Andy Murray's coach) to oversee the festivities. Hong Kong is one of only four places besides India, China, and Japan to collaborate with the AELTC to stage the Road to Wimbledon event. RTW first started in Hong Kong in 2016 and we are delighted to confirm that we have also secured rights to host the event for the upcoming 2 years.

With regards to office administration, a computerized system was developed to manage the Association's expanding database earlier this year. This deployment will not only streamline workload and improve efficiency, it is decidedly more user-centric, as the system's capability also includes online applications for membership, tournaments entries, league scores submission, and retrieval of players' results.

Back in 2017, we announced an overall 40% increase in prize money for the women's events at the Prudential Hong Kong National Tennis Championships, with the intention of achieving gender parity within the next 24 months. I am delighted to report that equal prize money became a reality this year, as evidenced by the rise in payout for the ladies' singles champion from HK\$ 28,000 in 2017 to match the men's singles pay cheque of HK\$ 42,000 in 2019.

We received news that the ITF Board of Directors approved Dr. David Ho as a recipient of the ITF Services for the Game Award. This honor is formal recognition of his contribution to the sport of tennis through extended and exemplary service on Committees of HKTA. He is one of the longest-serving Councillors (1979-1998 & 2002-present), Vice-Presidents (1985, 2002-2013), and Executive Committee members (Chairman, 2016-2018; Member 2002-present) in HKTA's history. His body of work serving Hong Kong tennis over the past four decades is a testament to his passion and dedication to the game. He is truly deserving of the award.

It was a great pleasure to work with our HKTA Council Members and office staff over the past twelve months. Owing to our passion, dedication, and teamwork, we made important strides in furthering the development of the sport and our Hong Kong representatives brought home some unprecedented results. As we continue to broaden the game's participation base, we have also stepped up community engagement efforts through our CSR initiatives to bring tennis to those who might otherwise lack the means or opportunity to experience this wonderful game of ours. As the governing body of tennis in Hong Kong, we shall endeavour to build on existing partnerships and collaborate with all our stakeholders to provide the direction and vision going forward.

## CLASS OF 2019 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Inaugurated in 2003, induction into the HKTA Hall of Fame is the ultimate honor in Hong Kong tennis that recognizes a player's achievements in the sport, as well as a contributor's services to the game over the years. The honor cements that distinguished individual's place in the annals of local tennis history. To date, only ten enshrinees and nine inductees reside in the Hall of Fame.

The Class of 2019 HKTA Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be held on 13 December at Olympic House. Legendary players Randall King, Mark Bailey, Edwin Tsai, KC Dao, and long-time administrator and contributor Janet Hardisty have all played a significant role in shaping the Association through its success and progress over the years. Their names will forever be remembered as part of Hong Kong tennis history's storied past.



### MARK RUSSELL BAILEY

Hong Kong's most decorated Davis Cup player, Bailey holds virtually every all-time Hong Kong record in the team event, including most total wins (29-16), most singles wins (17-13), most doubles wins (12-3) and most years played (11).

He made his Davis Cup debut in 1982 and in 1988 was instrumental in securing victories over Iran, Singapore and Pakistan to earn promotion to Asia/Oceania Zone Group I for the first time since Hong Kong entered the event in 1970. In 1990 and 1991 he spearheaded two successive runs to the Group II finals and in his final appearance in 1992, helped clinch Hong Kong's last promotion to Asia/Oceania Zone Group I, teaming up with Michael Walker to come from two sets down to secure the deciding doubles rubber. In 2016, Bailey received the Davis Cup Commitment Award from the ITF for long-standing dedication to representing Hong Kong in the event.

As a junior player, together with Kelvin Ng, in 1981 he captured the boys' doubles title at the Asian Junior Championships in Hyderabad, India and was also a direct acceptance to the main draw of the boys' singles at Wimbledon.

He has also won the men's singles title of all three local majors, capturing the SCAA Open in 1986, CRC Open in 1986 and 1987, and the Hong Kong National Tennis Championships in 1989. In 1986, Bailey attained a career-high ATP Ranking of No. 594 in singles and No. 491 in doubles.







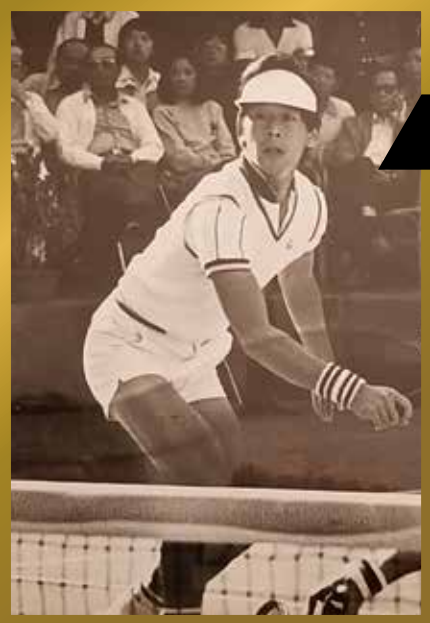
## JANET HARDISTY

Janet Hardisty dedicated more than 33 years of service to HKTA, and was instrumental in the development of tennis in Hong Kong during her tenure. Becoming an elected HKTA Councillor from 1976-82, from 1982-87 she served as HKTA's Senior Administrator and oversaw Hong Kong's acceptance as a member of the ITF in its own right.

From 1991-2000, she was the Executive Officer for both HKTA and Hong Kong Tennis Foundation (HKTF), overseeing the relocation of HKTA's offices from HKSI to Victoria Park and then finally to Olympic House, as well as a fourfold increase in the staff base of the Association. In 2005-13, Janet returned to become HKTA's General Manager and Executive Director of HKTF once again. During this span she worked tirelessly with HKTA's Executive Committee to facilitate the granting of the tender to HKTA to take over the Kowloon Tsai Park complex to redevelop into what is now the HKTA Tennis Centre.

In 2009, she was the Tournament Director for the East Asian Games tennis event, and worked extensively with the LCSD in the planning and upgrading of Victoria Park Tennis Stadium complex for the event. She was also the Tournament Director for an assortment of events, including an untold number of ITF Junior tournaments and other major regionals, such as the Asian Championships.

In 2006-07, Janet received an award for outstanding contributions to the development of sports and recreation from the Secretary for Home Affairs Commendation Scheme.



## RANDALL KING

Born in Portland, USA, King peaked at a career-high ATP No. 269 in singles in 1977 before arriving in Hong Kong, and reached a career high of No. 727 in doubles in 1984. In 1977 he competed in the men's doubles main draw at the US Open at Forest Hills. In 1978, King won the Hong Kong Invitational men's singles, defeating the top players from South Korea, Japan, and Indonesia. From 1980-82, he captured three straight CRC Open men's singles titles.

In 1985, King not only captured the SCAA and CRC Open men's singles titles, he also teamed up with Tau Luu to win the men's doubles at all three local majors – Hong Kong Closed Hardcourt Championships, SCAA Open, and CRC Open. At the Hong Kong Closed Hardcourt Championships, he won the men's singles title in 1981 and captured the men's doubles six consecutive times from 1980-85.

From 1984-86, King represented Hong Kong in five Davis Cup ties, in 1984 teaming up with Kelvin Ng to win the crucial doubles against Chinese Taipei in what turned out to be Hong Kong's maiden Davis Cup tie victory. He won crucial doubles rubbers that contributed to eventual victories for Hong Kong against Singapore in 1985 and Malaysia in 1986.

King also served as an HKTA Councillor from 1985-87 and is a member of the International Lawn Tennis Club (IC) of Hong Kong.



## EDWIN TSAI

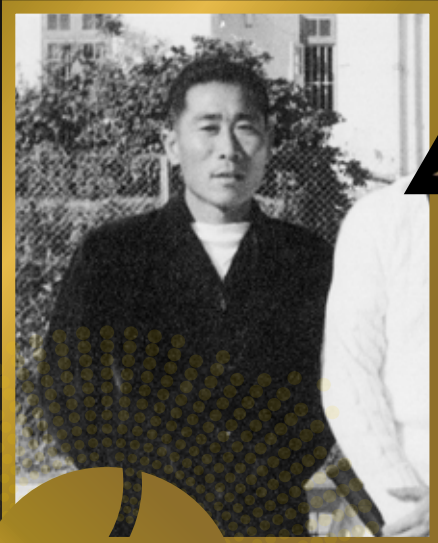
Edwin Tsai played men's singles and doubles at Wimbledon three years in a row from 1952-54. In singles he reached the second round in 1953 and 1954, in the former year defeating Headley Baxter, who went on to captain the British Davis Cup team in the 1960s and 70s.

In men's doubles he played alongside fellow HKTA Hall of Famer, Ip Koon Hung. They reached the second round in 1952 and in 1954 repeated the feat, losing to legendary doubles team Lew Hoad and Ken Rosewall. In mixed doubles, he teamed up with Bermuda's Heather Brewer to reach the last sixteen in 1953 and made the third round the following year together with American Kay Hubbell.

Locally, from 1955-60, Tsai reached six consecutive men's singles finals at the Hong Kong National Grasscourt Championships, a span during which he finished runner-up to Ip Koon Hung five times and once against KC Dao. In addition, he competed in nine men's doubles finals, winning in 1950, 1952, 1954-56, and 1962, and finished runner-up in 1957-58 and 1965. In mixed doubles, he lifted titles in 1953, 1955, and 1957.

Moreover, his prowess also extended to the hardcourts of the CRC Open where he triumphed in men's singles in 1955 and won the men's doubles a record eleven times in 1949, 1952-56, 1958-61, and 1963.

In 1973, Tsai served as Executive Vice-President of the Hong Kong Lawn Tennis Association.



## KC DAO (TO KWUN KAU)

Dao won the Hong Kong National Grasscourt Championships in 1958 and finished runner-up three times in 1952, 1953, and 1961. He was also a runner-up in mixed doubles together with Mrs. E. Tsok in 1952. At the CRC Open, he also claimed five men's singles titles in 1949-50, 1953, 1956 and 1961, which puts him third all-time behind only Ip Koon Hung with 11 titles and Tau Luu with 8.

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

## EUDICE CHONG, MAGGIE NG MEDAL AT WUG

At the 30th World University Games in Naples, Eudice Chong (Wesleyan) captured Hong Kong's historic first medal in singles with a bronze and then added a second one together with Maggie Ng (PolyU) in the women's doubles. The Wesleyan grad's "double bronze" set another precedent as she became the first player from Hong Kong to medal twice in tennis at the same Universiade. They are also the first players from Hong Kong to finish on the podium in the women's tennis events.

## JDC BOYS TOP 8 IN THE WORLD



Back in April, the team finished in 2nd place at the Asia/Oceania Qualifying to book their Finals ticket.

Coleman Wong, Tim Gauntlett, Oscar Wai, and Stephan Ehrhrt (Captain) took the under-16 boys' team to an unprecedented 8th place finish at the 2019 Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas Finals to earn Hong Kong's finest ever result in this event since the ITF first introduced the competition in 1985. This year's team finished ahead of traditional powerhouses, including the likes of Czech Republic and Australia.

The All England Club brought over Jeremy Bates, Lucie Ahl, and Jamie Delgado and they conducted workshops for local coaches, as well as clinics for juniors. Besides China, India, and Japan, Hong Kong is the only RTW destination and HKTA has also secured hosting rights for the coming two years.

## EFG HKTA TOUR TEAM

The objective is to give these talented athletes the added support to advance their ambition, as they strive to become the best tennis players they can be. ## HKTA STAGES ITS FIRST BEACH TENNIS TOURNAY

In October, HKTA organised its first-ever Beach Tennis Tournament at the Hong Kong Resort, Discovery Bay, where Aziz Khan/Vincent Chau won the men's title, and Nicole Tsang/Venise Chan bagged the women's equivalent. Beach Tennis is one of the fastest growing global sports, but a newcomer to local shores. The ITF Beach Tennis Tour (BTT) began with 14 tournaments in 2008 and, by 2016, that figure has exceeded 300. By 2017, the US\$ 500,000 prize money barrier was cracked.

## DR. DAVID HO RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED ITF AWARD

The Board of Directors of the International Tennis Federation approved Dr. David Ho as a recipient of the ITF Services for the Game Award. This honor is formal recognition of his contribution to the sport of tennis through extended and exemplary service on Committees of HKTA. He is one of the longest-serving Councillors (1979-1998 & 2002-present), Vice-Presidents (1985, 2002-2013), and Executive Committee members (Chairman, 2016-2018; Member 2002-present) in HKTA's history. Dr. Ho is only the fifth recipient from Hong Kong to receive this award.

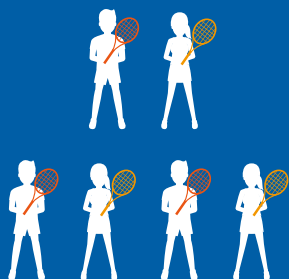

## Year in Review

The past year has seen the Executive Committee (Exco) continue to focus on strengthening HKTA's key partnerships. Prudential Hong Kong Limited, HKTA's Lead Partner continues to provide year round support as title sponsor of the Hong Kong Tennis Open as well as sponsor of the Hong Kong National Tennis Championships, the Summer, Winter, Mixed and Junior Club Leagues, and our grassroots 'Tennis Rocks' community program. This year the EC has also fortified its other key strategic partnerships in the commercial sector, securing new three-year agreements with EFG, The Hong Kong Jockey Club and Nissin.

Exco oversaw the signing of a three-year partnership with EFG, forming the 'EFG HKTA Tour Team' initiative, to provide funding support for touring players as part of the EFG Young Athletes Foundation. The HK\$ 3 million matching fund over the next three years will allow talented young players to travel with a personal trainer and physio when competing overseas. The first beneficiaries, Cody Wong and Eudice Chong, have recorded impressive results this year under the scheme. Cody reached the semi-finals of the US Open junior girls doubles event, the third round of the girls singles at Wimbledon and won her first pro ITF singles title at the 15K event in Hua Hin, while Eudice captured six ITF doubles titles and reached World No. 173 in doubles, alongside two bronze medals at the 2019 World University Games in Naples.

A further key partnership was renewed with a three-year agreement secured with The Hong Kong Jockey Club. The HKJC Charities Trust confirmed to fund a further three years of the 'Tennis Rocks' program with an increased HK\$ 27 million in support, which will run until 2022. The expanded program will extend the reach of the initiative, covering four more districts for 'Tennis Rocks' and 'Senior Tennis Rocks' and including people with hearing impairments in the 'Special Tennis Rocks' program.

Last but not least, a three-year extension of the partnership with Nissin, HKTA's 'Official Youth Development Partner,' was signed this year. Nissin will continue as title sponsor of the National Junior Tennis Championships, Hong Kong Junior Tennis Series and the Hong Kong Junior Tennis Novice Competition. In addition, a series of Nissin Tennis Clinics have been organized this year and will continue to be arranged to nurture local tennis development by offering expert guidance to aspiring youngsters and adult enthusiasts.

## Year in Review

2019 saw some exceptional results from our local players in both individual and team competitions overseas, providing a launching pad for even more impressive achievements in the coming 12 months. Developing and growing our players, from grassroots to elite level to reach these top-tier results takes an extraordinary amount of hard work, coupled with talent, as part of a player development program that incorporates talent identification and nurturing. The Player Development Committee's (PDC) primary goal is to cultivate and grow tennis in Hong Kong through expanding grassroots development and nurturing players with the potential to achieve a high level of performance in the sport, which in turn inspires others to pick up the game.

PDC is committed to encouraging more youngsters to play tennis, and investing more resources into talented players with the drive to commit to the sport. This system of development is key to preparing players to compete for Hong Kong at the junior level, and later in Davis Cup, Fed Cup and other national team events, as well as flying the flag for the region on the professional circuits. Developing and training our players to the highest level is key to ensure Hong Kong continues to reach the goal of being a genuine contender in major competitions and events in Asia and worldwide.

## Kowloon Tsai ITF National Training Centre

In 2018 HKTA applied for National Training Centre status with the ITF, with the HKTA Tennis Centre at Kowloon Tsai Park identified as the ideal venue. NTC status recognizes excellence in coaching and program development with all relevant HKTA staff, both coaching and administrative, taking part in the evaluation process.

NTC status will further recognize HKTA as a leader in player development in Asia. While benefiting our local players through closer collaboration with other players in the region, we will also fulfil our unofficial responsibility by assisting our less-prosperous tennis neighbours.

Recognition will complement our ITF Bronze status in Coach Education, with the endorsement process being completed by December this year.



## Revamped National Training Squad (NTS)

Since the appointment of Mr. Stephen Ehritt as Head Coach and Program Manager at Kowloon Tsai at the beginning of 2019, the NTS program has undergone some significant philosophical and organisational changes. Apart from bringing a new level of discipline to daily training, the NTS has expanded with a number of new initiatives.

Whereby the focus is still on the development of junior players, many of our post-junior players have begun taking part in daytime training, and "paying-back" by hitting with our junior players in the evenings. Daytime sessions are also available to junior players who have access to flexible schooling times.



Working with the Hong Kong Sports Institute (HKSI) program, the NTS is also assisting the HKSI part-time junior girls, with player training at Kowloon Tsai (KT) two days per week. Both the NTS and HKSI programs have benefited from this collaboration.

The Fast Track initiative is conducted on Saturday mornings at KT, and aims to address technical flaws in the next generation of targeted players, from the NTS program at Causeway Bay. The NTS has also introduced a renewed focus on fitness and physical performance, with KT now boasting three specialized gym spaces.

## Player Development

The NTS, consisting of approximately 60 players, continues to act as a bridge between the feeder squad from below and HKSI Elite at the peak. NTS, made up of our top juniors, aged 12-16 years, represent the players that will be playing for Hong Kong in annual ITF team events and ITF junior ranking tournaments. They are the players that will be representing Hong Kong in the Davis & Fed Cups, All China Games and Eastern Games in the future. We continue to emphasize the importance of a 'team' philosophy to cultivate a strong sense of unity and to instill personal pride in our players.



Below NTS, NTS Futures, Elite Development (Green/Yellow), Squad Potential, and the Young Athletes Training Scheme are components of the feeder squad, which comprises roughly 700 players. Talent identification programs play a key role in attracting beginners and retaining their participation, whilst also ensuring a steady stream of players will continue to feed up the development pyramid. There are currently about 4,000 players within the talent identification base sections.

The Tennis Rocks Program is a key grassroots initiative, taking a proactive approach by offering free introductory tennis lessons to primary and secondary school students, as well as coaching training to teachers. It also acts as a useful platform to drive participation by encouraging schools to include tennis as part of their school's regular PE curriculum.

The Mini Tennis Promotion Scheme, which includes Primary School Promotion, Regional Training, and Regional Competitions, continues to be the prevalent avenue for novices to start playing tennis. Youngsters also have the opportunity to participate in the game outside of school sports, such as through the popular Daikin Hong Kong Tennis Stars of the Future Program.



## HKTA Endorsement Scheme



The HKTA Endorsement Scheme commenced on 1 January 2019. The aim of the scheme is to officially recognize private coaches, clubs and companies that deliver quality tennis programs in Hong Kong to assist in lifting the standard of coaching in the private sector. As the parent body of tennis in Hong Kong, the HKTA believes it is essential to have an effective and cooperative relationship with the private sector, recognizing best-practice in coaching, competition, and tournament programs.

HKTA have committed to acknowledging, recommending and supporting private programs which maintain high standards, and satisfy the criteria of the HKTA Endorsement Scheme.

There are four categories for endorsement:

- 1. Mini-Red Programs**
- 2. Mod-Orange Programs**
- 3. Junior Participation (Green and Yellow ball) Programs**
- 4. Tournament Player (High-Performance) Programs**

Private providers must meet specific criteria for an individual category to gain endorsement in that category, including attending and presenting at HKTA workshops during the year. The process is not designed to be arduous, but is put in place to ensure private programs underpin and support existing HKTA player development programs, particularly the National Training Centre, National Training Squad, and NTS Futures program. After being awarded, endorsements will be reviewed every 12 months.



## Rankings and Results

Our homegrown players achieved some exceptional results over the past 12 months.

On the pro-circuit, Eudice Chong excelled in doubles this year, capturing six 25K ITF World Tennis Tour doubles titles and reaching a career high doubles ranking of 173 in October. In singles she reached the final of the 25K in Namangan, Uzbekistan and a further semi-final and two quarterfinals on the ITF Circuit during the year.



Cody Wong posted some outstanding results during the 2019 season. Consolidating on her 2018 year end finish within the top 30 juniors in the ITF rankings, she participated in all four junior Grand Slams, with her best singles result being a third round appearance at Wimbledon, whilst in doubles she notched a quarterfinals finish at the French Open and a semi-finals showing at the US Open. She became the first player from Hong Kong to win the singles title at the J2 Hong Kong Open Junior Championships, alongside victories at the J1 in Nanjing and J3 in Jakarta. She also captured her first senior professional title on the ITF at only 17 years old, triumphing at the 15K in Hua Hin in October.

Coleman Wong also posted a first for Hong Kong by winning the prestigious Junior Orange Bowl under-14 singles title in December 2018. During the year he also captured the J4 singles title in Ipoh, Malaysia and the singles and doubles trophies at the J4 in Jakarta. He also reached the singles final of the J2 in Shanghai. Coleman was also triumphant at the Dunlop Road to the Australian Open 2020 competition in Yokkaichi, Japan in November, securing himself a Main Draw Singles Wild Card to the Australian Open Junior Championships in January 2020.



Meanwhile, Kai Wai Yu won the J4 Hong Kong ITF Junior Tournament 2019 and attained a semi-final finish at the J2 Hong Kong Open Junior Championships, alongside three J4 victories in Shenzhen, the final of the J3 in Guangzhou and a semi-final at the J1 in Nanjing. He also reached the final of the JB1 in Seogwipo in Korea, finishing runner-up to fellow Hong Kong player Sebastian Nothhaft. Both Coleman and Kai Wai Yu were also part of the senior Davis Cup team during the season.

Hong Kong recorded remarkable team results during the year. Both the boys and girls teams in the World Junior Tennis (WJT) and Junior Davis and Fed Cups finished in the top eight in the Asia/Oceania Final Qualifying. The under-16 team of Coleman Wong, Tim Gauntlett and Oscar Wai achieved an unprecedented result of eighth place at the Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas Finals in Florida, Hong Kong's best result since the event was first held by the ITF in 1985.





Hong Kong posted a record medal haul of five medals at the 2nd National Youth Games in Shangxi, highlighted by Marvin Lee and Kelly Leung's gold medal in mixed doubles. Marvin Lee also teamed up with Tim Gauntlett to capture a silver in men's doubles, while Kelly Leung partnered with Sheena Masuda for another silver in women's doubles. Bronze medals also went to Gauntlett and Masuda in mixed doubles, as well as Johnny Lee and Oscar Wai in men's doubles.

Hong Kong also captured its first ever singles medal at the World University Games in Naples, Italy, with Eudice Chong claiming bronze. Eudice also teamed with Maggie Ng to capture a bronze medal in doubles, becoming the first local player to win two medals at the same Universiade.



The Hong Kong senior team consisting of Brian Yeung, Jack Wong, Sunny Yue, Wu Ho Ching, Maggie Ng and Ki Yan Tung beat Malaysia 3-2 in the final to win the 2019 Belt & Road Initiative Colourful Yunnan International Tennis Tournament in October, seeing off 21 other teams from China, South Asia and South-East Asia. The junior team, comprising Marvin Lee, Johnny Lee, Abby Fung and Kaye Au-Yeung, claimed third place.

At present, three men, five women, and four juniors are committed to playing full-time for the year 2019/20. They are Jack Wong, Brian Yeung, Kai Wai Yu, Zhang Ling, Eudice Chong, Ng Kwan Yau, Wu Ho Ching, Maggie Ng, Roger Ng, Cody Wong, Tim Gauntlett and Sheena Masuda. Intensive training and high-level coaching and conditioning are provided to these players on a full time basis to support their efforts to reach increased levels of performance.

Three men concluded the 2019 season with ATP rankings in singles, while seven players ended the year with WTA singles rankings:

We will also be growing our support programs for local players with HKTA Academic Scholarships for players wishing to play full-time and study in Hong Kong. Lastly, “Project 21” is in the planning stages and will be rolled out in the coming year. The project targets the best local players in each age group to prepare them for international success both individually and in representing the national teams in 2021 and beyond.

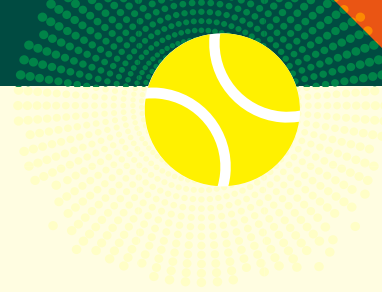

## Year in Review

The Tournament Committee (TC) recognizes the vital importance of competitive match play in the development of aspiring young players and raising the overall standard of the game in Hong Kong. It is the Committee's goal to create ample opportunities for local players to compete by organizing a calendar of tournaments with as many competitions as possible for players of all ages and levels.

In 2019, HKTA organized three 25K Men's and three 25K Women's events, a total of six ITF World Tennis Tour Men's/Women's events. Four ITF World Tennis Tour Junior events (one J2, two J5 and one J4) were also staged. Two Asian Tennis Federation (ATF) 14 & Under events also took place in July. Local events organized include the Prudential Hong Kong National Tennis Championships, NISSIN Hong Kong National Junior Tennis Championships, NISSIN Cup Noodles Hong Kong Junior Tennis Series, and NISSIN Demae Icho Junior Tennis Novice Competitions.

This year we registered 882 entries for the NISSIN Hong Kong National Junior Tennis Championships and a total of 2000 entries in the Junior Series, with an average of 400 entries for each competition, and an average of 280 entries in each Junior Novice Competition. We also lowered the age eligibility to include six-year-olds for the Novice Competitions. To provide more match play experience for 12 & under players, a Community Tennis Competition was organized for the seventh consecutive year with approximately 120 participants. The TC also organized four mini red tennis competitions for children aged six and under. The goal of these competitions is to provide an early start for young participants through play with soft tennis balls.

In 2019, HKTA implemented a new online tournament registration system for players to more easily enroll in HKTA tournaments. The system also provides live match result updates from the tournament website so players can check the recent match progress of their tournament.

In 2019, Hong Kong hosted six US\$ 25,000 ITF World Tennis Tour Men's/Women's events at Victoria Park Tennis Stadium. These tournaments attracted players from over 40 countries to compete in the region. It also offered local players an opportunity to play against touring professionals from overseas. On the men's side, the best performer was Brian Yeung, who reached the doubles final at one of the events with his partner Xin Gao from China, while Wong Chun Hun advanced to the semi-final of the same doubles draw with Michael Zhu from USA.

## ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors

The HKTA organized four ITF World Tennis Tour Junior events at Victoria Park this year. At the ITF J4 in January, Kai Wai Yu claimed the boys' singles title. On the girls' side, Jenny Wong and Sheena Masuda won the doubles title and Jenny reached the semi-final in singles. At the ITF J5 in July, Lin Wing Ka claimed the girls' singles crown, while Jenny Wong partnered with Sheena Masuda to win the girls' doubles title. The boys' best result was attained by Tim Gauntlett and his partner who captured the doubles trophy. In November, Cody Wong was crowned champion at the girls' singles J2 tournament.

In Week one, Dasson Chan claimed the boys' singles title, while Chloris Li came third in the girls' singles. In week two, Dasson captured his second boys' singles title, while Chloris claimed the girls' crown. They also teamed up with Wang Sui Lun and Michelle Wong, respectively to finish first in both boys' and girls' doubles.



## Prudential Hong Kong National Tennis Championships 2019

The Prudential Hong Kong National Tennis Championships 2019 consisted of nine events: Men's & Ladies' Singles & Doubles, Men's & Ladies' President Cup Singles & Doubles, and Mixed Doubles. For the third year running, the total number of entries exceeded 950. Kevin Wong defeated Brian Yeung, 6-3, 6-3, to win the men's singles title, while Lin Wing Ka beat Maggie Ng, 2-6, 6-2, 6-1, to lift the ladies' crown. Brian Yeung and Lee Hsin Han teamed up to beat Jack Wong and Kevin Wong to claim the men's doubles. Maggie Ng and Sher Chun Wing saw off Ki Yan Tung and Jacqueline Law to defend the ladies' doubles title. The mixed doubles title went to Chattida Thimjapo and Lee Hsin Han, who beat Lin Wing Ka and Vincent Chau, 6-1, 6-2 in the final.

## Nissin Hong Kong National Junior Tennis Championships 2019

Nissin was the title sponsor of the event for the third consecutive year. The juniors competed in 18 events: Boys' and Girls' 10U, 12U, 14U, 16U & 18U singles and Boys' and Girls' 12U, 14U, 16U & 18U doubles. The number of entries totaled over 880. ## NISSIN Cup Noodles Hong Kong Junior Tennis Series 2019

## NISSIN Demae Iccho Hong Kong Junior Novice Competition 2019

## Hong Kong District Tennis Circuit 2019

The Hong Kong District Tennis Circuit is one of HKTA's local circuits for adult players. The tournament has seven competitions throughout the year from April to November and matches were played at different venues including the Hong Kong Tennis Centre, Chai Wan Park, Shek Kip Mei Park, Tsing Yi Park, King's Park Recreation Ground, Morse Park and Junction Road Park. The winners and runners-up of each competition received an invitation to play in the Grand Masters held in December at Victoria Park. The approximate number of entries this year was 750.

## Community Junior Tennis Competition 2019

The community tennis events for Boys' and Girls' 12U is a bridge between the Junior Series and Junior Novice competitions. It is an integral and popular part of the tournament scene in Hong Kong and each year tennis events are organized in all the different districts, enabling players of all standards to compete. For the competitions in 2019, over 500 entries participated in four competitions, with the draws divided into Hong Kong Island, Kowloon, and New Territories. The Federation of Community Tennis Clubs and Lions Clubs International District 303 Hong Kong & Macau supported the competition in 2019, with the Grand Masters scheduled in Mid-December.

## HKTA Mini Red Competition 2019

HKTA Mini Red competition is a starting point for players aged six & under. A total of four competitions were held this year at Yuen Chau Kok Sports Centre, Lai Chi Kok Park Sports Centre, Wong Chuk Hang Sports Centre, and Wai Tsuen Sports Centre. The number of entries of Competitions 1 to 3 exceeded 500 and Competition 4 will be held in December.

## Davis Cup & Fed Cup by BNP Paribas

In the Davis Cup, Hong Kong was defeated 4-0 by Chinese Taipei at a home tie in September at Victoria Park. Hong Kong will contest the 2020 World Group II Play-offs in an away tie against Poland on 6 and 7 March 2020.

In the Fed Cup, Hong Kong won all three of its ties at the Asia/Oceania Group II event before falling 2 – 1 to Uzbekistan in the promotional play-off finals this year. The Fed Cup 2020 will be played in June 2020 in Malaysia.



## Guangdong - Hong Kong Cup Tennis Tournament 2019

The tournament was held on 19 & 20 January 2019 at Craigengower Cricket Club with the aim of promoting tennis and interaction between Guangdong and Hong Kong. Jack Wong, Kevin Wong, Brian Yeung, Wu Ho Ching, Maggie Ng, and Jennifer Sher were the home representatives that saw off the visiting team from Guangdong 4-1 to lift the inaugural Guangdong-Hong Kong Cup.





## Asia / Oceania IC Rod Laver Junior Challenge 2019

The International Lawn Tennis Club of Hong Kong (IC) staged this year's Asia/Oceania IC Rod Laver Junior Challenge from 23 to 25 July at the Hong Kong Country Club. Under-16 teams from Australia, Hong Kong, India, Japan, and Pakistan battled for the right to advance to the Worldwide IC Junior Challenge Finals in La Jolla, California, USA in 2020. With a round robin format, the Japanese team came out on top to qualify for the Worldwide Finals, whilst the team from India came in second place and Hong Kong placed third.

Aside from the competition, all the participating juniors assisted in an IC Philanthropy clinic for disadvantaged kids. With great competitive spirit all week at The Hong Kong Country Club, players truly exhibited the IC motto of "Hands across the net, friendship across the ocean".

## Year in Review

The League Management Committee (LMC) is tasked with overseeing the promotion, marketing, and management of all league tennis that is organized or sanctioned by the HKTA. The Summer and Winter Leagues continued to show growth in participation this year, with over 180 teams and 3600 players from 41 clubs playing in league competition in 2019. In addition, HKTA also held the Mixed Doubles League, Veterans' League (run jointly with the Hong Kong Veterans' Tennis Association), Two Court League (run together with the Federation of Community Tennis Clubs), and the Junior League (Spring and Autumn), ensuring ample competitive opportunities for players of all ages and abilities.

League tennis in Hong Kong celebrated its 110th anniversary in 2019, with the first league launching in 1909 with just seven teams. Since those early days league tennis has grown immensely and remains as popular now as ever, thanks to the large number of tennis enthusiasts in the region. In just the ten years from the Winter League 2008/2009 to the Winter League 2018/2019, the total number of players registered a growth rate of 19.6%, while the total number of teams increased by 12.9%.

This year also saw the introduction of the league online system for entering match scores, which was launched for a trial period during the Winter League 2019/2020, with full match score submission through the online portal becoming mandatory for the Summer League 2020.

## Year in Review

The Coaches Development & Qualifications Committee's (CDQC) responsibility is to develop the continuous education and professional development of coaches in Hong Kong. The training of local coaches to meet the standards recognized by the ITF and HKTA is key, as the improvement of coaching and, in turn the standard and growth of tennis in Hong Kong is driven by a systematic development program of certified coaches at all levels.

After receiving Bronze recognition for coach education from the ITF in 2017, satisfying and achieving the rigorous criteria and standards set by the ITF Task Force on Coach Education for silver level recognition remains a key goal. Reaching the next level of recognition of our national coaching program will allow Hong Kong to become self-sustainable in organizing higher levels of coach educational courses going forward.

## ITF Recognition & Impact

Significant improvements have been implemented following Bronze recognition from ITF. A key improvement is an increased number of tutors to run elementary coach courses, allowing the program to be self-sustaining with less need to recruit overseas tutors. These tutors can also be mentors to young coaches in Hong Kong, providing continued education to them. By having more qualified tutors and having our tutors run the programs themselves, we are taking the necessary steps to move towards ITF Silver recognition.

## Certification & Licensing

Since 2003, HKTA has collaborated with ITF to organize a series of high-level certification courses for coaches in Hong Kong to ensure the quality of coaches. The HKTA Coach Certification Scheme comprises three levels of coach certifications — Elementary, Development and Advanced.

During the year we conducted two Elementary Level courses, one Development Level course and also supported the Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme through delivery of Mini-Tennis Instructor courses to teachers from primary schools.

The HKTA Coach Licensing Scheme provides a benchmark for assessing coaching levels in Hong Kong and ensures the upgrading and enhancement of coaching standards locally. Its tiered structure offers various levels and paths for further progression and professional development of coaches. Additionally, the licensing of coaches provides a formal recognition for the coaches themselves, while safeguarding and reassuring the tennis public.



## Workshops and Seminars

Workshops and seminars are vital to the continued education of coaches. These workshops are organized to expand the opportunities through which our coaches can further enhance their knowledge that is needed to stay at the forefront of the coaching industry. During the year, CDQC organized nine workshops with a total attendance figure of 300, including the below:

## ITF Worldwide Coaches Conference 2019

The 21st ITF Worldwide Coaches Conference 2019 was held in Bangkok, Thailand in October this year. HKTA supported nine coaches to attend the biennial conference, joining 600 coaches from 113 countries at the three-day event. The theme of the conference this year was 'Maximising the player's journey: The coach as facilitator and team leader' and keynote speakers included Grand Slam champions **Emilio Sanchez**, **Mark Woodforde** and **Mary Pierce**, as well as ITF President David Haggerty.

The action packed program for the conference featured a dozen keynote presentations around a specially laid hybrid clay court, plus 32 breakout sessions on everything from stroke development and predicting elite success to motivating and retaining junior girls in the sport. Alongside demonstrations of blind tennis, wheelchair tennis and integrated doubles (wheelchair and able-bodied), there were panel discussions on women in tennis and making the transition to the pro tour.

## Plan for 2020

The Committee plans to review the content and requirements of the coach licensing scheme in order to better align with current needs, and will continue to source parties that can offer us relevant knowledge through workshops. Additionally the Committee is looking to increase the numbers of female coaches, in particular to travel with junior female players to overseas tournaments.

As the number of school training programs continues to increase, the Committee plans to conduct a pilot scheme to assess the optimum method of training persons interested in tennis to be capable of helping with coaching duties in schools with participation programs. As red ball coaches require less training time, the pilot scheme will be launched to explore training persons in a scheme outside the official coach certification program, with a view to increasing the number of red ball coaches in schools. In addition, the Committee will continue to evaluate the arrangement of coach certificate courses in order to improve the quality of the certificated coaches.

## Year in Review

The Officiating Committee (OC) is committed to continually improving the overall standard of officiating in Hong Kong. During the year, training courses were conducted to provide upgrading channels for existing officials and to bring new members to the group. At the same time, we continue to encourage more officials to attend available ITF workshops to upgrade their knowledge and to gain further experience by working at overseas tournaments. HKTA officials worked on a challenging schedule of nearly 60 tournaments and events in 2019, including the ITF World Tennis Tour Men's/Women's and Junior tournaments. Several local officials also worked at a number of ITF, ATP, and WTA events overseas during the year.



## HKTA National Level Umpire Training Course

HKTA holds a National Level School annually to recruit new officials to cater for the increasing number of tournaments organized every year. Approximately 60 candidates successfully completed the National Level Umpire Training Course conducted at Olympic House and Victoria Park Tennis Stadium in May and June 2019. HKTA will also conduct a third course in December.



## Officials Refresher Courses, Training & Referee and Chief Umpire Course

A Refresher Course and a Referee and Chief Umpire Course were held on 13 May 2019 at Victoria Park with Silver Badge International Referee, Charles Lau, from Hong Kong as a lecturer. During the course, updated rules and regulations and important rule changes in 2019 were explained and discussed. Other matters, such as scheduling, how to handle difficult situations during matches, and issues about sign-ins and lucky loser arrangements were also covered. The other Refresher Course was held on 10 June 2019 led by Chen Shu, a Gold Badge International Referee who shared tournament experiences and scenarios.

The Shenzhen Guangming New District Tennis Association invited a number of officials to take part in the officiating for the 2019 Shenzhen-Hong Kong Tennis Competition – ITF Shenzhen Seniors Circuit in October.

ITF Officiating organized a Referee Refresher Seminar from 12 to 13 October 2019 in Bangkok, Thailand. Mr. Charles Lau, Hong Kong's only Silver Badge International Referee was invited to attend the seminar. During the seminar it was emphasized that the scope of work of a referee is constantly changing and a referee's role is to adjust to the new challenges at all levels.

It was outlined that the ITF is also working to improve co-operation amongst the governing bodies (ATP, Grand Slam tournaments, ITF and WTA). To achieve this effectively, it had been decided to arrange refresher seminars for all certified referees, similar to those that were offered several years ago. Referees are required to attend refresher seminars every four years, with the next seminar due in 2022.

ITF Officiating formed the Advantage All campaign, based around five key themes and is aimed at improving gender equality in all areas of the game to ensure tennis is a leading light for sport both on and off the field. Ms. Molly Kam participated in the course during the week of 4th November 2019 during the ITF World Tennis Tour W100 in Shenzhen.

Part of the campaign is to encourage nations and regions to implement initiatives to help empower and inspire others and to raise visibility of those women who are already part of our leadership, as role models to others. This is about empowering girls and women, mentoring them, training them and building their confidence.

## Eyes<sup>3</sup> Technical Operations Training Course

Eyes<sup>3</sup> conducted a technical operations course on 1 August and 4 December at Victoria Park, which was attended by 18 officials and tournament staff. The Eyes<sup>3</sup> staff taught the umpires how to set up and arrange the Eyes<sup>3</sup> system for pre-tournament, during tournament and tournament completion stages for line calling detection, live scorekeeping, live match video streaming and match highlights. These functions of the Eyes<sup>3</sup> system have been employed at local HKTA tournaments starting in August this year.



## Annual Dinner

The Official Dinner for the OC and officials took place at the Club de Recreio on 24 April, 2019. More than 50 officials attended the event, and a lucky draw was conducted during the dinner.

## CSR Committee's Directive

The Community & Social Responsibility Committee was formed in 2016 to drive and execute HKTA's community and social responsibility initiatives, expand its community engagement and oversee its fundraising activities. The two primary goals of the Committee are to provide more opportunities for the less privileged and under-resourced to take part in the game and to promote tennis as an enjoyable way of engaging in active, healthy lifestyles to all parts of the community.

## Programmes Supervised by CSR Committee

Three primary programs are under the Committee's remit- HKTA Tennis Rocks, HKJC Tennis Rocks and the HKTA and NGO outreach tennis programs for children with special educational needs.

### HKTA Tennis Rocks

Launched in 2014, HKTA Tennis Rocks offers free tennis training to kids in five districts across Hong Kong, namely Tuen Mun, Kwun Tong, Yau Ma Tei, North District and Shatin. Funding was received from Prudential, Ruckus Networks (an ARRIS company), as well as internal funding from HKTA. Targeting beginners aged twelve and under, the program aims to give participants a grounding in the basic skills of the game and offer character building challenges and help develop positive values in kids who may otherwise not have opportunities to play tennis. Participants are also encouraged to enter tennis competitions, such as Inter-Primary school tennis and mini-tennis competitions, and HKTA subsidizes selected individuals in order to do so.

HKTA Tennis Rocks also provides other opportunities for kids to experience tennis outside of the regular training sessions, with meet-and-greets with national players, workshops, the opportunity to attend tournaments and participation in clinics with star players.

## Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme

The first three-year cycle of The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust funded project “Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme” was successfully completed this year after its launch in 2016. A three-year extension of the project, to run through 2022, was again supported by The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, and with an increased funding amount of HK\$ 27.88 million. This has facilitated expanding the programme, increasing coverage from 10 to 15 districts for students and seniors, and adding beneficiaries from other groups, such as those with hearing impairments and Down Syndrome.

Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme seeks to promote tennis to individuals of all ages and abilities, consisting of four targeted programs: ‘Tennis Rocks’ for grassroots primary school students, ‘Special Tennis Rocks’ for students with special educational needs, ‘Teach the Teachers Tennis’ for physical education teachers, and ‘Senior Tennis Rocks’ for retirees and seniors from 55 to 68.

Over the first three years of the initiative, more than 4,000 students across 52 schools have taken part in ‘Tennis Rocks,’ whilst more than 210 participants have joined the ‘Special Tennis Rocks,’ including those from special schools. Of these participants, 92% have improved their physical activity level after joining the initiative and 100% improved their ability to express.

A total of 78 PE teachers have been trained as part of ‘Teach the Teachers Tennis,’ with 100% saying the course has helped them develop their tennis teaching skills and concepts, 95% of participants agree the course has taught them how to plan a teaching syllabus and around 70% would advise the school to place tennis in the regular PE course syllabus.

Over 1,300 people aged 55 to 68 have participated in ‘Senior Tennis Rocks’ during the first three years of the program. The program has led to 97% of them becoming happier and 96% of attendees improving their physical activity levels, 92% increasing their confidence in sport and physical activities as well as 93% expanding their social network and meeting new friends through participation.

## HKTA and LSSA Outreach Tennis Program

Since 2017, HKTA's outreach tennis program, in collaboration with the local NGO Learning Support Service Association (LSSA), have been offering tennis training to children with special educational needs studying at mainstream schools, including those not served under the HKJC Tennis Rocks initiative.

## HKTA and Heep Hong Society & Hong Kong Down Syndrome Association

Phase I Training for Heep Hong members commenced on 22 February at the HKTA Tennis Centre with a total of 97 participants. Phase II of the training kicked off on 20th September at the HKTA Tennis Centre with approx. 70 participants.

A training program with the Hong Kong Down Syndrome Association was held from April to June 2019 at Chai Wan Park Tennis Court with a group of 10 participants, aged 25-35.

Both Heep Hong Society and Hong Kong Down Syndrome Association expressed that the participants enjoyed the tennis training and were looking forward to continued support from HKTA.

## Key Activities

Some key activities took place over the past 12 months. A special tennis clinic, The IC Rod Laver Worldwide Junior Challenge was conducted at the Hong Kong Country Club in July, giving youngsters from the Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme the chance to play on synthetic grass courts and try out orange balls, as their training is usually conducted with red balls. Fun games also formed part of the clinic, which included interaction with the visiting Japanese team from the tournament.

An Inter-School Competition was organized for the participants of the Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme in January. A total of 206 students joined the singles and doubles competitions in different age groups. In addition, friendly matches between different schools were held in July.

In 2019, HKTA introduced a pilot programme called Mod-Orange, which provided a second experience of orange ball training for those students that had completed the one-year Jockey Club Tennis Rocks Programme.

An Inter-District Competition was also organized for the Senior Tennis Rocks participants in January. 93 teams participated in men's and women's doubles competitions, while others helped out in other aspects of the competition, such as registration and photo taking, or as cheerleaders for their own district's participants.

## Wheelchair Tennis

This year saw the introduction of HKTA's first wheelchair tennis initiatives, in co-operation with the Hong Kong Federation of Handicapped Youth (HKFHY). A coach workshop was first conducted with wheelchair tennis experts during the Regional Coach Conference in 2018, with further coach development sessions conducted by Hong Kong based wheelchair players following the conference.

The first wheelchair tennis trial day for novice adult players was successfully held in June 2019 in conjunction with HKFHY with 26 participants attending. This was followed by regular wheelchair tennis training sessions starting in August with 12 participants. A second wheelchair tennis trial day was conducted in September 2019 with 10 participants. We are grateful to the Hong Kong Tennis Foundation for their support of this program.

Additionally, ITF launched a global Wheelchair Tennis Development grant this year which HKTA successfully applied for. The grant can be utilized to support training and equipment expenses, the cost of sending an ITF specialist coach to develop wheelchair programs and travel grants for travel to overseas tournaments. The ITF grant supported two local wheelchair players to attend the Taipei Open which took place in November 2019.

- 505 retirees have enrolled in Senior Tennis Rocks Phase 2
- 72 students with special education needs have participated in training in Phase 2 to date

## Plans for 2020

With the launch this year of the HKTA Wheelchair Tennis program in collaboration with HKFHY, we will continue to further develop this program in 2020 with funding support from the Hong Kong Tennis Foundation and the aid of the ITF development grant.

The Committee will further review the structure for future fundraising activities and develop a governing system for recruiting donations and other CSR-related proceeds and applying them to our community programs and activities. With the establishment of the HKTA Foundation, which is a charitable institution registered under section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance, in the near future, we aspire to organize fundraising activities in 2020 for promoting and implementing existing and new community programs.

## Year in Review

The Membership and Corporate Affairs Committee (MCAC) maintains HKTA's membership database and procures sponsorship for its events and programs. It also manages all of the editorial content published by HKTA across its various platforms and oversees the dissemination of information to members, affiliated & league clubs, sponsors & supporters and the public. Individual and club membership remained steady this year, delivering continued stable revenue for HKTA.

A new sponsor, Kidsland was secured to sponsor two ITF tournaments (one men's event and one women's event) held in December 2018 and January 2019, and Tonghai Financial was also the title sponsor for an ITF Women's US\$ 25,000 event in January 2019. These sponsors significantly reduced tournament operational costs in addition to further promoting the events to the public. The Corporate Patron Scheme continued this year, offering participating organizations a range of benefits, and HKTA will continue to build and expand the scheme in the future.



## Corporate Patron League 2019

In April and May this year, MCAC organized the 27th Dr. Henry Fok Corporate Patron League. A record breaking 41 teams, totaling more than 200 players took part in this year's event. The tournament adopted the same format as in 2018 with two groups, the Corporate Event and Corporate Open Championship Event. Due to inclement weather, the event added an extra day on 12 May, nevertheless all matches were successfully wrapped up.

The event raised more than HK\$ 170,000, an increase on last year, with all surplus funds going towards junior tennis development in Hong Kong. MCAC is looking to continue to expand the CPL to a much wider spectrum of business sectors in the future.

Increasing the profile of HKTA and reaching new target groups were an emphasis of our website and social media content during the year. Over the past 12 months, articles published on [www.tennishk.org](http://www.tennishk.org) generated more than 40,000 views, as well as more than 6,000 Facebook, Instagram and Twitter followers combined, a 20% increase year on year. An emphasis was placed on posting video content rather than purely text and photos to make the posts more engaging and grow their organic reach. We also delivered a monthly e-news update, and two issues of a physical copy of the HKTA newsletter in Summer and Winter to keep HKTA members, fans, and sponsors well-informed of the latest activities in Hong Kong tennis.

The membership system was also updated, with a fully digital and eco-friendly paperless online platform to replace the old system. ## Year in Review

During the course of the last 12 months, the Governance Committee has continued to pursue its mandate to monitor, review and upgrade HKTA's governance and compliance policies and practices. 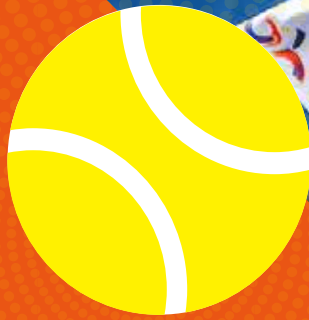
