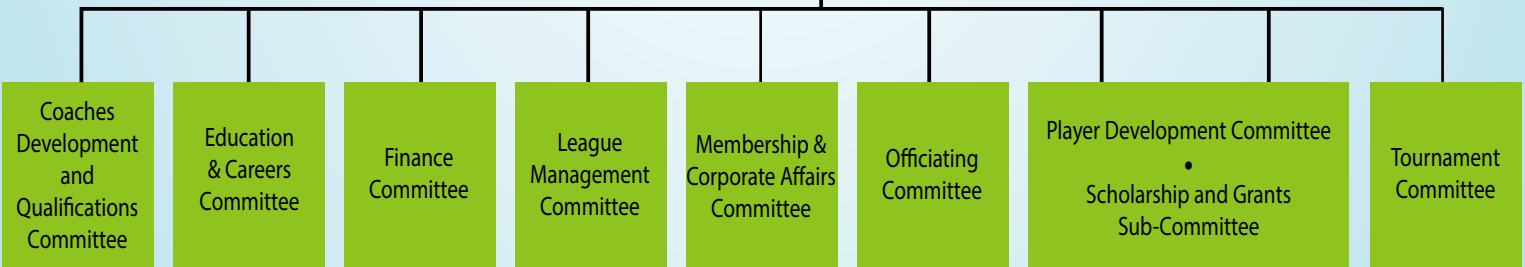

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR



- The Hong Kong Davis Cup Team was promoted to Asia/Oceania Group II after finishing in second place at the Asia/Oceania Group III competition in Dubai in September.
- HKTA confirmed Hong Kong's first tournament on the official ATP or WTA circuit in 12 years with the announcement of the WTA Hong Kong Tennis Open which will be held from September 8-14th 2014 at Victoria Park. A launch party was held on November 20th attended by business leaders, players & VIPs from the tennis world, Government Officials and media to officially introduce the tournament to the world.



- Zhang Ling reached the final of the Asian Championships Singles event and Zhang Ling and Katherine Ip advanced to the doubles semi-finals, scoring Hong Kong valuable points to apply for Elite Sport Status.
- HKTA hosted 4 ITF Women's Circuit Tournaments (three 10K & one 25K level) in December 2013 & January 2014. Hong Kong players earned valuable ATP & WTA ranking points at the 3 ITF Men's Futures and 2 ITF Women's Circuit Events in December 2012 and January 2013.
- Zhang Ling won 2 consecutive ITF Women's Circuit US\$15,000 tournaments in Phuket in November. Katherine Ip won the US\$10,000 ITF title in New Dehli in August.
- Hong Kong's Men's and Women's teams both finished in 8th place at the All China Games Team Competition in June.
- In 2013, Hong Kong had 31 ITF ranked juniors, 4 WTA and 2 ATP ranked players.



## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

- Katherine Ip reached a career high ITF Junior ranking of 35, and played in all 4 junior Grand Slam Tournaments during the year. Brian Yeung reached the second round of singles and the doubles quarterfinals at the Australian Open Boys Events.
- HKTA President Vincent Liang was elected as a member of the Asian Tennis Federation Seniors Committee.
- HKTA attended a WTA Summit and Tournament Director Orientation in Beijing during the China Open.
- With the re-opening of the tennis courts at HKSI, a new elite training programme named the “Hong Kong Team” was launched in September 2013 and run by a professional coaching team, led by world renowned coach Alan Ma. 30 players were selected to join the programme.
- Hong Kong’s Gary Au Yeung obtained ITF Gold Badge Referee certification.
- An ITF coaching course was conducted by ITF representative Karl Davis for coaches in April.
- Zhang Ling was awarded a Panasonic Sports Scholarship Programme 2013-2014 from the Sports Federation and Olympic Committee of Hong Kong and the Shun Hing Group.
- Stephen Wong won the Hong Kong Selection tournament and represented Hong Kong to participate in the Longines

Future Tennis Aces Tournament during the French Open at Roland Garros in June.

- Eudice Chong claimed both the singles and doubles titles at the Hong Kong ITF Junior Tennis G4 Tournament in January. Andrew Li and Tommy Lam won the boys doubles title.
- Eudice Chong and Katherine Ip were runners up in the girls doubles event at The Oriental Watch Group Hong Kong Open Junior Championships 2013 in October. Claire Spackman reached the girls singles semi finals, whilst over 80 Hong Kong and overseas junior players battled for precious world ranking points.



- The Hong Kong Boys and Girls Teams finished sixth and seventh respectively out of 16 teams in the playoffs of the 2013 Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup Asia/Oceania Final Qualifying tournament in Gimcheon, South Korea.
- HKTA Recorded a surplus of over HK\$1.8 million for the year ended 31st March 2013.

# REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT



This is my second annual report as President of the Hong Kong Tennis Association and during the past year there have been an exciting number of developments. You can read about these from the reports of our various committees in the following pages, but I would like to highlight some of the notable happenings in the past year.

## Hong Kong Tennis Open

This year we continued with our commitment to bring more world class tournaments to Hong Kong and enable our players to compete on the world stage. HKTA has been working proactively with the Government to bring a tournament on the top tier professional tour back to Hong Kong and I am pleased to confirm that with a grant from the HK Government, the Hong Kong Tennis Association is now the proud owner of a WTA International Event, the Hong Kong Tennis Open. By the time of the inaugural Hong Kong Tennis Open in September next year, Hong Kong will

not have hosted a professional event on the official men's ATP or women's WTA Tours in 12 years, after the ATP Salem Open left the region after its 2002 event. The tournament will see some of the world's best female players compete for USD250,000 prize money at Victoria Park Tennis Stadium from September 8 - 14, 2014 and will be a treat for tennis fans in the region.

The hosting of a WTA tournament and the return of elite professional tennis will have a positive impact at all levels of the sport and in the community. Not only will it serve as an inspiration to young players looking to represent Hong Kong at an elite level, it will also encourage players young and old to pick up a racquet and play, boosting the popularity of tennis in the region and promoting participation in our grass roots and other development programmes.

Of course the tournament will also provide our top players with the opportunity to compete on the world stage and with some of the best players in the world. We look forward to our top ITF ranked junior players as well as our WTA ranked players, including Zhang Ling, Katherine Ip and Tiffany Wu to experience competition with the world's best. HKTA believes we will have a top 100 player within the next few years, and the Hong Kong Tennis Open will serve as an inspiration for our players to reach this goal.

## ITF Women's Pro Circuit

After the success of the 3 ITF Men's Futures and 2 ITF Women's Circuit tournaments in December 2012 & January 2013, the Council decided to hold 3 Women's ITF USD 10,000





tournaments in December this year and one USD 25,000 tournament in January 2014 at Victoria Park. With the hosting of a higher level 25K event we are expecting some higher ranked players, including some in the top 200 to compete. In addition to our top players who will receive direct entry, our local players will have the privilege of getting wild cards to enter these events and the possibility of earning some international ranking points, whilst getting professional tournament match play experience. The tournaments will also provide Hong Kong tennis fans with the opportunity to watch professional tennis live and up close over the four week period.

## Reopening of the HK Sports Institute in Shatin

This year also marks the completion and reopening of the tennis courts at the Hong Kong Sports Institute (HKSI) after 6 years of closure due to the 2008 Olympic Equestrian events. The Sports Institute has six hard courts, of which 2 are covered, and two clay courts. The Player Development Committee has appointed renowned international coach Alan Ma and his professional team to train our Hong Kong Team of 30 elite junior players and full time players, based at HKSI and we look forward to some positive results from this initiative.

## New Plexipave courts at Kowloon Tsai Tennis Center

With a financial grant from the Sir David Trench Fund, we were able to have all eight courts at Kowloon Tsai HKTA Tennis Centre resurfaced with Plexipave IW. Plexipave IW is a slower speed surface compared to traditional courts. The rationale behind this is that the trend for top level hard court tournaments worldwide, including the Australian Open and US Open is to move to a slower surface to enable longer rallies and greater entertainment value, and the HKTA wants

our top players and juniors coming to practice and play tournaments on this surface in Hong Kong so that they are prepared for tournaments overseas.

## Upgrading of HKTA Website

The re-development project of the HKTA website commenced during the summer and will feature a totally new look and many additional functions for members and tennis fans and players. I look forward to the unveiling of the revamped site in early 2014.

## Davis Cup Promotion

I am pleased to report that Our Davis Cup Team, consisting of Philip King, Ognian Kolev, Andrew Li and Tommy Lam and captained by Chris Lai have achieved promotion back into the Davis Cup Asia/Oceania Group II after finishing in second in the Group III competition in September. A special mention must go to the titanic efforts of Philip King and Ognian Kolev who came through some tough matches in the searing Dubai heat. We wish them luck in their tie against Thailand during Chinese New Year.

Our Fed Cup Team also narrowly missed out on promotion to Asia/Oceania Group I, finishing second in Group II after losing to Indonesia in the playoff match, but defeating New Zealand, Vietnam and Turkmenistan in the group rounds.

## Our Players

Katherine Ip reached an all time high ranking of 35th earlier this year on the Junior ITF rankings. She qualified to play in all 4 Junior Grand Slam events, reaching the second round at the Australian Open and Wimbledon singles events and she captured her second ITF Women's Circuit title at the





USD10,000 tournament in New Dehli in October.


Hong Kong's No.1 player, Zhang Ling is now on the way back up and overcoming injury problems after having surgery early this year and I am pleased to report she recently won two ITF Women's Circuit USD15,000 tournaments in Phuket in November. We expect to see Lynn continue to register strong results and improve her ranking to her previous level in 2014.

I am proud to report that Harvard has accepted another one of our junior players, Brian Yeung. This is the second consecutive year in a row Harvard has accepted a player from our Association.

## **Our Staff**

In 2013, we had 13 staff working in Olympic House and 9 staff working in the HKTA Tennis Centre at Kowloon Tsai Park. On the coaching side we have 11 international qualified full time coaches and a fitness trainer. All of these staff work hard to ensure that the numerous programmes and events organized by the Association are professionally run.

Finally, I want to thank all the hard working and dedicated Council Members and Committee Members who put in many hours of their free time to further the development of tennis in Hong Kong. I also thank all the individual members and the affiliated member clubs of HKTA for their support of the Association throughout the year. I must also give thanks to the Home Affairs Bureau, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department, the Hong Kong Sports Institute, the District Boards and many other bodies that HKTA have had dealings with. Their support to Tennis in Hong Kong is much appreciated.

# EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The role of the Executive Committee (EXCO) as well as fulfilling its Terms of Reference is to ensure that the Mission Statement of the HKTA is followed, and meetings are held throughout the year whenever any important issues need to be addressed and resolved between Council meetings.

In the past year, many meetings have been held between EXCO members, executive staff and government departments concerning important matters, in particular the upcoming 2014 WTA event, the Hong Kong Tennis Open, which was a major focus of EXCO in 2013. The WTA event, along with human resources issues, tournament sponsorship and the numerous day to day affairs of the HKTA as directed by the Council have kept EXCO busy throughout the year. During 2013, this roster of areas that EXCO have been actively involved in include:

- The preparation of an open tender document, sent out in July to sports marketing and PR agencies that had expressed interest in being the event operator and/or PR marketing service provider for the WTA Tournament. Upon receiving the tenders, EXCO spent a considerable amount of time reviewing and deliberating on the positive and negative attributes of each proposal and interviewed a number of tendering companies in person and by phone. EXCO also consulted with HAB on the appointment and drew up an Assessment Chart. After the appointment of the event operator, EXCO immediately

set to work with the planning stages of the tournament in conjunction with the event operator, the appointed Tournament Director, Stephen Duckitt and HKTA Staff. EXCO discussed in detail the terms of the management agreement between HKTA and the event operator. EXCO liaised with HAB, the Tourism Commission and MSEC on the Government funding options as well as with LCSD on the venue requirements and renovations. At the end of September several members from EXCO attended a WTA Summit and Tournament Director's Orientation in Beijing during the China Open to further understand the requirements of running a WTA International Event. They also decided on the official name for the event- "Hong Kong Tennis Open."

- Working with the Committee Chairs and departmental managers to prepare and adopt the HKTA Annual budget for 2013/2014 and to prepare and confirm the yearly plan for 2013/ 2014 for presentation to the LCSD. In the yearly plan, all budgeted activities and expenditures are laid down in detail to enable the LCSD to ascertain the level of the support they will give to the Association for the coming year.

- The preparation of IASS scholarship funding applications for 27 athletes. All the athletes had attained results during 2012 - 2013 that gave them the required 3 Elite Vote points to be eligible for HKSI funding for training, overseas tournaments and equipment. The tournament and training plans for these athletes were prepared by the staff and the coaches and during the year the activities and the spending of the IASS holders players from 2012-2013 also had to be carefully monitored.
- To ensure a good line of communication and understanding between EXCO, the Executive Director and members of the HKTA office and coaching staff; the operation of the HKTA is divided into six main streams: coaching, development, tournaments, corporate affairs and administration as well as the HKTA Tennis Centre at Kowloon Tsai Park. Each department has a competent manager and enthusiastic and good staff who report to the Executive Director. The HKTA currently employ 22 administrative and executive staff, and 10 fulltime and 3 part time contracted coaches. This does not include all the licensed coaches who coach the squads and open enrollment programmes, and the officials who work at all the tournaments. These part time workers number over 240 on a regular basis. Salary payments and tax forms have to be completed for all these employees both full and part time, and this takes a good deal of the administrative time. The monthly balance sheets are regularly scrutinised by EXCO to ensure that the budgets are being adhered to.
- Regular communication is kept and meetings are held with the Executive Director of the HKTA to ensure that the staff follows the guidelines set by the HKTA Council, and the various other committees for all the programmes and activities organised by the HKTA. The Executive Director helps the members of EXCO fulfill their duties and liaises



with the LCSD, the HKSI, the Sports Federation and Olympic Committee (SF&OC), the International Tennis Federation (ITF), government departments and other sporting bodies on a day-to-day basis.

- Our international relationships remain good. Close contact is established with the parent body the International Tennis Federation and in July the President attended the AGM of the ITF held in Paris. This is always a great opportunity for HKTA to share and exchange views with other National Associations.
- Our relationship with China and the Chinese Tennis Association is healthy and the yearly Inter-city Tennis Association Tournament between Jiangmen, Macau and Hong Kong was held this year on 7th and 8th December in Jiangmen. EXCO members together with other members from the Council played in the two day event at the CTA Jiangmen Tennis Training Centre. Next year the event will be hosted by HKTA in Hong Kong.



- This year our players were kept busy representing Hong Kong in a number of team and individual competitions, including the Davis and Federation Cups (both junior and adult), the East Asian Games, the All China Games, the World University Games and the Asian Youth Games. EXCO, along with the relevant committees ensured that the selection for these events was in line with the HKTA guidelines that state, amongst other criteria, any player in Hong Kong wherever he or she trains, who are of a suitable standard to play in these events, will be invited to join the training squad.



- The best result of the year came from our Davis Cup Team whom placed 2nd out of the 8 nations

competing at the Asia/Oceania Group III competition in Dubai and were promoted back into Group II for 2014. Hong Kong will be returning to Group II after being relegated to Group III and will take on Thailand in their first round tie in January. Our Fed Cup Team narrowly missed out on promotion to Asia/Oceania Group I in Kazakhstan, finishing second in Group II out of 11 teams after losing to Indonesia in the playoff match.

- Other notable results include Hong Kong's Men's and Women's Teams finishing in 8th position at the 12th All China Games in Dalian. The result matches Hong Kong's performance in the 11th All China Games team event held four years ago and placed them in the top third of all teams competing. In the playoffs of the 2013 Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup Asia/Oceania Final Qualifying tournament in Gimcheon, South Korea The Hong Kong Boys and Girls Teams finished sixth and seventh respectively out of 16 teams in Gimcheon, South Korea. At the East Asian Games Women's Team Event, Hong Kong narrowly missed out on a medal, losing 2-1 to Korea in the bronze medal match.
- Our Juniors competed in many events internationally in 2013 in both the 18 and under and 14 and under age groups, achieving some good results, and as of the end of November on the ITF 18 and Under World Rankings there are a record 31 HK players. The Player Development Committee and the coaches had their hands full scheduling these tournaments. The PDC organised several tours during the year and EXCO keep an eye on the composition of the tours to make sure there is fair play and that all juniors, should they deserve it and want it, travel to the tournaments chosen by the PDC.
- Many other meetings, events, prize presentations and official dinners were attended by EXCO members during the year and the Chairman Mr. Vincent Liang was also kept very busy attending official functions organised by SF&OC, LCSD and various other bodies in Hong Kong.

### ***Terms of Reference***

- i. The Executive Committee is a standing committee of the HKTA Council and is empowered to exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of the Council on any matter within the Council's jurisdiction where decisions have to be made and actions taken between regularly scheduled Council Meetings or where specific responsibilities have from time to time been delegated to the Committee by the Council.
- ii. It will also make decisions within the policies, strategies and agreed budget of the Council, conduct programme evaluation and perform internet audits.
- iii. The Committee will assist in the development of agendas for HKTA Council Meetings and will review recommendations from the President.
- iv. It will make recommendations to the Council on matters of future policy, government and external relations, media policies, conflicts of interest issues, strategic planning, funding and resource allocation, as well as on matters not assigned to other committee.

# MEMBERSHIP & CORPORATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

The Membership & Corporate Affairs Committee (MCAC) continued to act as the medium of communication between the HKTA and its members, affiliated and league clubs, sponsors, and tennis enthusiasts in the business sector. The latest local tennis news was promptly released through both the HKTA website and the HKTA newsletter, as well as selected press releases.

The Dr. Henry Fok Corporate Patron League celebrated its 21st year during 2013, with the format introduced in 2012 of splitting the teams into two draws (Corporate Draw and Corporate Open Draw) once again proving popular. 31 teams and more than 260 players took part in the CPL this year and HKTA received positive feedback from many companies and their teams. The surplus of the Dr. Henry Fok Corporate Patron League was over HK\$120,000 which was applied to various HKTA junior development programmes.

Individual and club membership remained steady during the year and generated a stable income for the Association. The HKTA newsletter also created another source of income by offering advertising space to the sponsors.

The HKTA website redevelopment project began this year, with the development stage commencing in July and progressing through the second half of the year. The aim is to improve the HKTA website design & look, user friendliness & functionality and to widen the scope of services that can be provided to members and other users. The newly developed website is expected to go live in early 2014.

The MCAC also focused on finding sponsors for HKTA's tournaments throughout the year. A number of sponsors were secured for the Corporate Patron League, whilst a title sponsor, Oriental Watch Company, along with support from HKTF and product sponsors was secured for the Hong Kong Open Junior Championships, held in early October. Most sponsorship efforts were focused on the ITF Women's Circuit Series of three USD10,000 and one USD25,000 tournament in December 2013 and early January 2014. Despite a difficult

search, with the support and assistance of key Council Members, Chevalier Group came in as title sponsor, in addition to 12 other sponsors and support from HKTF.

Procuring sponsors for these events remains difficult in the current climate and will again be a focus for the MCAC in 2014. To help promote and create coverage of the ITF Women's events in the local press and assist with building value in the tournaments to find sponsors in the future, a PR Agency was engaged to conduct PR services for the events, including arranging press conferences, sending out results updates & press releases and organising media interviews.

The promotion of the latest tennis news was a key focus in the past year. More stories and results were added to the website to keep members and tennis fans abreast of the latest results of our players and developments in the local tennis world as they happened. In addition a HKTA Facebook page and Twitter account were established to further engage tennis fans through new social media. Press releases were sent to key media outlets for big news stories, such as the HK Davis Cup Team promotion to Asia/Oceania Group II, which picked up coverage in publications such as SCMP.

Apart from the junior programme, there is also a full time programme under the team. Therefore, Zhang Ling returned to Hong Kong to train and is now based here as one of the players in this programme. Other players are Andy Lau, Andrew Li, Tommy Lam, Jeff Chan and Ng Kwan Yau.

## Zhang Ling

On June 14th, the Sports Federation and Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China and the Shun Hing Group jointly officially announced the 10 awardees of the Panasonic Sports Scholarship Programme 2013-2014 and our very own Zhang Ling was among the recipients. Under the Programme, each of the awardees receives a total subsidy of HK\$150,000 over 18 months within the period between May 2013 and October 2014. The focus of the Sports Scholarship is to assist them to better prepare and strive for the best results in the Incheon 2014 Asian Games in Korea by providing financial support towards the cost of their training, specialized coaching services, medical and scientific assistance.



## National Programme

The presence of the Hong Kong Team Programme allows the HKTA National Programme to have more spots available for younger players. In the new season, there are eighteen top juniors aged 12 and under training at the HKTA Tennis Centre (Kowloon Tsai Park) and Causeway Bay Sports Ground 4 day per week which is led by Leo Liu, Ronald Xu, Keith Lo, Jaime Monfort and David Catala respectively. As per last year, those players who follow the below rationale are eligible to be reimbursed for part of their tournament expenses based on the results achieved as an incentive. The overall objective is to raise the tennis level of local players.

- Age 14 - to win an ITF group 5 or above
- Age 15 - to win an ITF group 4 or above
- Age 16 - to win an ITF group 3 or above
- Age 17 - to win an ITF group 2 or above
- Age 18 - to win an ITF group 1 or above and a main draw match in an ITF Pro Circuit 10K or 15K



## Junior Team Events

Following the same process as in the previous year, the selection in 2013 was mainly based on Round Robin results which aim to ensure that the selection procedure is well defined and executed in an open and fair way which sends the best teams to compete in the events.

The Asia/Oceania qualifying for the Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup was held in Gimcheon, South Korea in April. The boys' team of Andrew Li, Jack Wong and Alan Sou finished in 6<sup>th</sup> position. The girls team of NG Kwan Yau, Claire Spackman and Janet Law finished in 7<sup>th</sup> position.

At the WJT Asia/Oceania Final Qualifying in Kuching, Malaysia, the Under-14 Boys' Team of Alan Sou, Lam Ching and Alan Lee claimed 6<sup>th</sup> place, while the girls' team consisting of Claudia Ng, Jacqueline Lam and Nicole Tsang finished in 11<sup>th</sup> position.

## Longines Future Aces



Hong Kong player Stephen Wong received an admission ticket to Roland Garros and a tee with his name embroidered on it at the official award presentation ceremony organized by sponsor Longines at the Ocean Terminal Main Concourse in May. He represented the territory at the Longines Future Tennis Aces 2013 at Roland Garros where sixteen players from around the world competed

for the prestigious annual 13 & Under tournament during the French Open fortnight.

## Elite Development

The Elite Development Programme (ED) continued to serve as a platform with clearly defined structures and competitive pathways in order to facilitate a player's progression towards the National Programme and beyond. In 2013, there were more colour balls groups organised at Hong Kong Tennis Centre, Sai Wan Ho, Shek Kip Mei, Yuen Long, Tuen Mun and North District in order to include more younger players in the programme and provide an intensive training for them at an early stage.

Throughout the year, apart from training, camps and tours were organised during long holidays which aim to develop





players' touring and independent skills. Touring is great fun and a great learning experience for players who wish to pursue tennis as a profession and be constantly travelling around the world.

The Committee will continue to work hard to explore avenues for improving the effectiveness of training and we are looking forward to seeing our juniors from the ED programme succeeding into the National Squad and Hong Kong Team.

## Junior Tennis Squad



With more than 800 players in the programme, the Junior Tennis Squad was an important channel for the growth of a broad base of tennis-playing youngsters in Hong Kong and serves as a major channel through which talent is identified and promoted to join training at higher levels.

In 2013, the total number of squads was seventy-three and organised at 25 venues, with players having undergone systematic training all over Hong Kong, Kowloon and the New Territories. They are supervised by a group of experienced HKTA licensed coaches. At the end of the season, a Squad meet was organised and it consists of a parent seminar, fitness workshop and a presentation.

With the support of Longines this year, twenty aged 10 and under players were selected to receive free extra training and the overall objective is to develop a player up to the level for competing in the Longines Future Tennis Aces when he/she reaches 13.

## Young Athletes Training Programme

As usual, open assessments were held every 6 months and were conducted by a selection panel. The panel would ensure that those with "champion potential" are spotted and evaluations were conducted regularly to make sure the players were given a progressive pathway to developing their true potential in the game.

It is a programme for players aged 10 and under and the training was using Green balls and was closely monitored by our Technical Executive and a group of HKTA licensed coaches. Players in this programme need to fulfill the requirements set, like attendance and tournament commitment.

The assessment for the new season was organized in September. 33 players out of 77 were selected, they are:

### HK Tennis Stars of the Future 2013

The programme has for years attracted thousands of newcomers to the game of tennis. In summer 2013, there were approximately 800 fresh new faces that picked up a tennis racquet for the first time, all of whom will hopefully, in time, learn to appreciate the time-honoured virtues of tennis and come to embrace it as “a sport for life”.

The programme is well structured with five stages to provide a systematic tennis training programme at entry-level for kids between the ages of 6-14. As the participants advance to a higher stage, their skill level and knowledge of the game will also increase correspondingly. The programme culminates with an age-group competition, which was a chance for the players and coaches to see how they have advanced after 6 months of training. Those who exhibit a keen talent for the game may also receive invitations to join various HKTA junior squads to further their development. With the support of LONGINES, HKTA have set up LONGINES Future Tennis Aces Scholarships in order to support players’ future training. The selection for the scholarships is mainly based on performance in the competition.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank LONGINES, Dunlop and LCS D. In the future, we are looking forward to meeting more young kids to discover their sporting potential and experience the fun of tennis through this programme.

### Mini-Tennis

The overall Mini Tennis Programme, which includes Primary School Mini Tennis, Regional Mini Tennis, and Kindergarten Mini Tennis Tour, has proven to be an invaluable and an enjoyable starting point for children looking to pick up tennis as an extra-curricular activity.



### Primary School Mini Tennis

With the generous sponsorship of Prince and the Hong Kong Tennis Foundation, the HKTA/Prince Mini Tennis Promotion Scheme is now in its 22nd year.

The Scheme consists of 4 components: namely School Visits, Teachers’ Training, District Inter-schools Competition and the Annual Championships. The 2012/13 Scheme has continued to receive overwhelming response; 41 Primary Schools have entered the Scheme and 406 juniors played for their schools in the Mini Tennis District Inter-Schools Competitions. In 2013, it was decided that red balls would replace foam balls in the competition. Before making the decision, red balls were sent to schools for trial and meeting with coaches and schools were organized. The Committee will continuously review the whole exercise and welcome feedback from schools.

### Regional Mini Tennis

As well as the HKTA/Prince Mini Promotion Scheme we currently have thousands of students who are receiving or have received mini-tennis training under the Schools Sports Programme that is jointly run by the HKTA and the LCS D. We also organise the Regional Mini Tennis Training Programme



which provides mini-tennis classes at different levels to help the children attain good results. In the past summer, training was organised in more venues which successfully attracted an additional two hundred 6 and under players to start the game. As well as the aforementioned programmes we also operate family mini tennis classes during weekends, allowing parents to participate together with their young children and give them guidance on how to enjoy playing and hopefully choose tennis as their “sport for life”. During 2013, the participation number continue to grow and we are looking for a more successful year in 2014 by adding more fun elements in the programme.



### **Kindergarten Mini Tennis Tour**

This year, the Mini Tennis Demonstration work continues. The HKTA has continued to contact kindergartens to arrange a fun and inter-active mini tennis day for those young children aged 5 and under at their schools. The response of the children has been great and the principals and teachers appreciate very much the extra value that has been brought to their school life by playing mini tennis. The Mini Tennis Demo Team will continue to work hard and visit more kindergartens and put rackets into the hands of the enthusiastic young children in the coming year.

### **World Tennis Day 2013**

2013 is the Centenary year of the International Tennis Federation and one of the celebration activities, the inaugural World Tennis Day, was held on March 4th. The theme of this year’s World Tennis Day in Hong Kong was Tennis10s. Tennis10s is a programme launched by ITF in 2007 aimed at increasing the worldwide tennis participation with the use of slower and lower bouncing balls and lighter and shorter rackets in tennis.

To promote the new form of tennis, we hosted a World Tennis Day festival in Stanley, where a Tennis10s demonstration was held. It attracted over 200 local teenagers to join the clinics run by HKTA professionals. These teenagers received instructions and advice in tennis on site, as well as a ticket to the BNP Paribas Showdown Hong Kong.

### **Community Tennis**

The LCSD, the FCTC and the HKTA have been working in partnership to increase participation across all sectors to fulfill our task of broadening the base of tennis participation in the territory.

In the CSC programme, a total of 35 community tennis clubs are affiliated with the HKTA, the highest number of community clubs amongst all sports in Hong Kong. In fact, since September 2010 we stopped nominating new clubs because of insufficient venues as each club is required to assign a venue as their home court and each venue can only entertain one club. Meetings were organized between HKTA and LCSD and it implemented an “In and Out” system in order to remove those non-active clubs and start considering new clubs to join. The system was set up based on the CSCs guidelines and the LCSD progress reports.

# COACHES DEVELOPMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

In 2013, localization has been the main direction for all works in the CDQC. The biggest project has been to increase the number of qualified tutors locally, and in the future we hope to have our own resources to develop local coaches. An ITF tutor course was conducted by ITF representative Karl Davis in April. Nine coaches (Cyril Lau, Terence Sher, Cheung King Kwok, Bronson Fung, Joey Kwan, Brian Lau, George Lee, Alvin Yip and Hugo Tse) participated in the course and they qualified as Level 1 Head Tutor, Level 1 Assistant Tutor and Play Tennis Head Tutor respectively.



The CDQC continues to provide learning and practical opportunities for the above qualified tutors. An ITF tutor from India was hired to conduct coaching courses with our tutors and during the courses the ITF tutor monitored their performance and gave suggestions for them to improve. Besides that, we hope the course can also successfully develop more local coaches in the near future.

## **ITF Endorsed HKTA Coach Certification Scheme**

In view of the need for quality coaches and a growing demand for certified tennis coaches, the HKTA collaborated with the ITF and launched the Certification Scheme in Hong Kong in 2003. Over the years, one Advanced Coach Course, 11 Development Coach Courses, 34 Elementary Coach Courses, 32 Mini Tennis Instructor Courses and 16 Pre-courses have been organized. In 2013, 90 candidates have undergone this Certification Scheme respectively in 3 Mini Tennis Instructor Courses and 1 Elementary Coach Courses that we organised.

## **HKTA Coach Licensing Scheme and Coach Benefits**

Initiated by the EQC in 2003, the HKTA Coach Licensing Scheme serves to provide a quality benchmark for accessing the overall standard of coaches. This year we have 273 coaches successfully registered under this scheme. The Scheme helps to fulfill the market demand for standardization in the coaching system and for coaches with recognised qualifications, and opens a learning window for the coaches to keep abreast of the latest coaching know-how and technology in the game of tennis through a continuous educational programme.

In 2008, it became the policy of the LCSD that any new tennis coaches who wish to register with them must possess an HKTA license. This arrangement has shown the strong commitment of the HKTA in safeguarding the teaching quality of coaches in Hong Kong.

The CDQC has been actively promoting the status of the HKTA licensed coaches in all of the HKTA programmes and on public courts throughout the year. The CDQC places a great deal of focus on the benefits for the licensed coaches and has endeavored to promote the licensed coach status to the tennis public. The CDQC has been liaising with potential sponsors with a view to providing tailor-made services and benefits for licensed coaches including discount purchase of equipment and uniform, etc.

The HKTA Coaches' Library, located at the HKTA Tennis Centre at Kowloon Tsai Park, provides another platform for the continual development and upgrading of coaches in

Hong Kong. The library contains the latest collections of essential publications, DVDs and videotapes from the ITF and well-established tennis academies. Licensed coaches are encouraged to fully utilize the valuable resources in the library in order to keep them abreast of the latest coaching knowledge.

As the Chairman of the CDQC, I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to Chickeeduck, Solinco, Wan Kee, Committee Members and speakers. See all of you at the Annual Party 2013.

# EDUCATION AND CAREERS COMMITTEE (ECC) ANNUAL REPORT 2013

Focusing on academic education and development, the major goal of the Education and Careers Committee (ECC) is to create a context for tennis and academics to go hand-in-hand so our players can excel in both.

The interest in admissions to top US colleges remained high in the past year and will continue so in years to come. Our junior tennis players have proven that their success on court extends to the classroom. The past year saw our top guns Brian Yeung & Kevin Wong, gaining entry to some of the best academic and tennis programs in the US with the likes of top national universities such as Harvard, Michigan, Berkeley, Rice, etc, as well as the most competitive liberal arts colleges, such as Claremont and Wesleyan.

Back in Hong Kong, we continued to see a significant rise in interests for our tennis players to pursue a place in local universities. Hong Kong Davis Cup member Ray Lam followed the footsteps of currently WTA-ranked Tiffany Wu and started his collegiate career at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Venus Pang, newly crowned CRC Open 2013 Schoolgirls Doubles champion, also joined Ray and Tiffany at PolyU. Together with former top junior Vincent Chau, they form one of the strongest local university tennis teams we have ever seen.

There is no question that without their own excellent discipline to maintain high academic results the players would not be able to meet the lofty requirements set by these institutions. Moreover, there is also no doubt that the better the tennis results our players can achieve, the more options open up to them. To this end, the Council has decided that the educational objective of HKTA is best served by merging the ECC into the PDC as a special Task Force so that the tennis and educational goals and policies of HKTA are strategized hand-in-hand.

Last but not least, as the Chairman of the Committee, I am most grateful to the contributions and enthusiasm of the committee members in the past year.

# TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE

2013 was full of excitement for the Tournament Committee; lots of good news and breakthroughs, and a few bad and strange ones. Let's start with the worst and strangest one; the Hong Kong Tennis Foundation (TF), with HK\$8 million in their reserve and all of their fund raising activities utilizing HKTA staff, turned down a HK\$300,000 funding request from HKTA to support the ITF Women's Pro Circuit Events, and only gave the HKTA HK\$100,000 citing the events lack audience and are not cost effective. The HKTA needed HK\$2 million to fund 4 of these events and only asked for HK\$300,000.

In the terms of reference of TF, it is stated very clear that their reason for being is to help HKTA raise funds to support tennis development in Hong Kong. These first tier pro circuit tournaments have proven to be an effective springboard for our top juniors to reach elite level tennis, testified by Katherine Ip's splendid results, having won two US\$10K events in the last 12 months in India. Katherine Ip went on to become our 4 pointer scorer in junior elite points, and being the doubles specialist that she is, she reached the semi-finals of the 2013 Asian Championships doubles with partner Zhang Ling, defeating the top seeded Thai pair in the quarterfinals in a thrilling 3 setter.

So wasn't that decision from the TF the worst and strangest for the HKTA Tournament Committee. Despite the setback from TF, the three US\$10K and one US\$25K pro circuit events will go on in December 2013, thanks to the generous support of our sponsors Chevalier Group, Cafe Deco, Fat Kee Stevedores, Fortune Pharmacal, The Fleming, Confederation Investment, Shun Hing Group, Bebegarten, SmarTone, Kona Deep, Sportline, GLP Sports, a few private donors, and Council members of the HKTA.

We move on to the good and great news. Hong Kong was relegated to Asia/Oceania Group III in Davis Cup last year. With a new team that consisted of Philip King, Ogi Kolev, Andrew Li and Tommy Lam and new Captain Chris Lai, HK won back to Group II. At the Fed cup, earlier in the year, though Zhang Ling was injured, playing Captain Venise Chan took a team of Katherine Ip, Tiffany Wu, Eudice Chong and

finished runner-up in Group II, the same result as in 2012. At the PRC national games, both our men's and women's teams finished in the top 8.

Another setback that we encountered was at the East Asian Games. We were unable to field 4 men and 4 women to compete, rejected by the SF&OC, who cited the level of our players as being too low. We would agree that the men's team wasn't competitive, but we had 4 women in the ladies team with a WTA ranking and they were all rejected by the SF&OC. After appeal, we were able to field 2 women; Zhang Ling and Tiffany Wu. Zhang Ling went undefeated in the women's team event singles, beating strong opponents from Korea and Taiwan. I would say HK missed out on a medal at this last EAG in the women's team event because we didn't have a women's team; our doubles specialists Eudice Chong and Katherine Ip were both rejected by the SF&OC.

At the Asian Championships, which is hot off the press, HKTA was able to field its own team of 4 men and 4 women and we broke through. Though the men's doubles team of Kevin Kung and Andrew Li only got to the QF, our ladies doubles team of Zhang Ling and Katherine Ip (doubles specialist) advanced to the semi-finals by beating the number 1 seeded Thai pair in a thrilling 3 setter 57, 75 and super tiebreaker 10-1. Then on the following day, Zhang Ling beat No. 2 seed Chen Chin Wei of Taiwan to advance to the semi-final of the women's singles, and eventually into the final, losing only to the No. 1 seed Nigina Abduraimova from Uzbekistan in 2 close sets. We did it. That is a 4 pointer in adult events. HK tennis can now apply to return to Elite Sports status in 2014 and enjoy the full privileges of training at the HK Sports Institute. After 5 years out of Elite Sports, we did it, our players did it. This is the happiest time of the HKTA.

As for juniors, all Hong Kong kids who signed up for the ITF G4 and G3 events got into the draw and had the chance to compete with internationally ranked juniors from more than 15 countries. Eudice Chong captured both the singles and doubles tournaments at the ITF G4 in January, whilst Eudice, paired with Katherine Ip were runners-up in the G3 doubles tournament in October. Many of Hong Kong's elite junior players also travelled overseas during the year to compete in ITF international junior team competitions - the Asia/Oceania qualifying for the under-14s World Junior Tennis Competition for both boys and girls, the Junior Davis Cup (boys), and the Junior Fed Cup (girls) for under-16 juniors.

The HK Junior Series continues to improve with record numbers of entries and better competitiveness under the improved age bracket system for the lower groups. Our National Junior Tennis Championships had more than 800 entries this year (an 8% increase year on year) and continues to go from strength to strength with the support of long time sponsor Lions Club International. We have also seen good participation in our Novice competitions, community tennis events and mini tennis programmes and this year the Committee organised four mini tennis competitions for children aged 6, 7 and 8, giving kids a starting point in their competitive careers.

All in all, it was an exciting and eventful year for HK tennis in competition terms, especially with the fantastic results from the Asian Championships bringing HK tennis back to Elite Sports. The TC will strive to achieve an even better competition environment for both our juniors and our aspiring pros in 2014. The TC's goal will be to work closely with the PDC to carve out a 5 year plan to allow HK tennis to remain in Elite Sports after 2019.

# OFFICIATING COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

It was a busy year for the HKTA officials, with 50 events in Hong Kong covered by the local chair, roving and line umpires. These events included the ITF World Tennis Day, ITF Women Circuit Tournaments, ITF Seniors Tournament, the two ITF international junior tournaments, the three major local tournaments – the Hong Kong National Tennis Championships, the SCAA Open Tennis Championships and the CRC Open – and numerous corporate, district & junior tournaments, competitions and leagues.

We also have some senior officials who had the opportunity to work at the International level in ITF, WTA and ATP events, these events included Davis Cup Groups III and IV. The Officiating Committee strive to focus on improving the standard of officiating at all levels and encourage more officials to attend ITF workshops to upgrade their officiating levels, and get further experience by working at international events.

The Committee is continuously concentrating on improving the officiating levels in Hong Kong through Officials Education Programmes, Players and Parents education and also by setting officiating policies and initiatives. Improving knowledge of the game and the rules is a major goal of the Committee by actively promoting the “Rules of Tennis” to as many tennis groups in Hong Kong as possible.

An Event Disciplinary Policy is continuously running at all tournament levels. This policy is for preserving the image and integrity of tennis in Hong Kong and to promote sportsman-like conduct in all events to which this Policy applies. This Policy provides the framework for dealing with event related breaches of discipline in a consistent manner. It provides the platform for the officials to successfully enforce the rules.

The Committee has built up an exchange program with other nations, so that our officials have more chances to work in professional events. We also invite higher ITF level overseas officials to work in our tournaments and share their experience with us.

Communication is one of the major developmental projects. A dedicated officials section will be set up on the HKTA website for both the officials and also for the public to enable them to understand more about the work of the Committee. The Committee will also promote officiating through the HKTA newsletter, with the aim of providing updated information and the sharing of experiences for both officials and casual readers.

The New Officials’ Uniforms have been distributed to all active officials this year, and the team uniform meets the Committee’s goal of a unified and professional appearance for all officials.

This year, HKTA had one Official attend an ITF Level 2 Officiating School in Bangkok, Thailand from 27 November to 1 December 2013. Hopefully more Hong Kong officials can reach the International level of officiating.

The Committee continuously runs National Level Schools to recruit new officials. 44 candidates successfully completed the Level 1 Umpires' Training Course that was held at Victoria Park in June. The official talent development program is currently running parallel with current and new umpires. Listed below is a breakdown of the qualifications of HKTA officials.

# LEAGUE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

The HKTA Tennis League is traditionally one of the most popular and arguably the longest running team event in the city, having three years ago celebrated over 100 years in operation. Many of the original clubs that participated still do so to this day and the league continues to grow with more teams each year.

In 2013, 39 member clubs and league clubs, 173 teams and more than 2800 players took part in the various divisions; the actual total registration of players over all the leagues was 12,000. The youngest player in the leagues is 6 years old, a participant in the Junior League and there are players in their late 70s, perhaps even into their 80s still playing league tennis. The two major leagues that are held each year are the Summer and Winter Leagues. In addition to these, a Mixed Doubles League, a Veterans League (run jointly with Hong Kong Veterans Tennis Association) a Two Court League (run together with the Federation of Community Tennis Clubs (FCTC)) and a Junior League also takes place over the course of 12 months.

The Committee is responsible for the promotion, management, and marketing of all League tennis, which is organized or sanctioned by the Hong Kong Tennis Association. Through the various club leagues, we are organizing fair competition in the social tennis world at all levels.

The HKTA is constantly searching for opportunities that will allow more clubs and players to participate in league tennis. The Two Court League is jointly organized by the HKTA and the FCTC, and it is aimed at providing league tennis to

all community tennis clubs and residential tennis clubs in Hong Kong. The target is those clubs and complexes that have only two available courts and are therefore not eligible to compete in the HKTA Leagues. In 2013, 97 teams from 29 FCTC member clubs and 4 HKTA member clubs and residential tennis clubs participated. This has been a very successful initiative and we will continue to search for ways of introducing other new and exciting ideas with the hope that we will attract even more players to league tennis.

## HKTA Tennis Convenors' Tournament 2013

The Fourteenth HKTA Tennis Convenors' Tournament was held on December 1 during the morning of "finals day" at the CRC Open 2013. This tournament is traditionally jointly hosted by the League Management Committee (LMC) and the Chinese Recreation Club. It is always a well anticipated and enjoyable event and 2013 proved no exception.

The trophy that all the players keenly compete for is the Convenors' Cup. This is a perpetual trophy that was donated in 1999 by HKTA Past President, Mr. Kenneth Tsui, in memory of his late father and uncle – Tsui Wai Pui and Tsui Yun Pui – affectionately referred to as "The Tsui Brothers". The exploits on the courts of these two remarkable tennis players from Hong Kong are well known to those who take an interest in the history of tennis in Hong Kong.
