## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

- Hosted the National Junior Championships in January 2012 at Victoria Park. The total number of entries since 2003 has reached over 5,000.
- Mr Vincent Liang, J.P. was elected as the new President of the HKTA at the AGM on December 15, 2011.
- 16 top players from Hong Kong, China, Taiwan and Thailand were invited to the Hong Kong Tennis Champions Cup 2011.
- Tennis Stars of the Future 2011 concluded on New Year's Day.
- 17-year-old Brian Yeung, the youngest Hong Kong players to possess an ATP Singles ranking and the first one with a ranking since 2008.
- HKTA has introduced a new junior ranking system that is effective for all 2012 tournaments.



- The 20th Anniversary of the Dr Henry Fok Corporate Patron League was held in May at Victoria Park.
- The Education & Careers Committee organized a US College Seminar in March to brief local junior players how to reach out to US college coaches and the academic requirements for college admission.
- Claudia Ng won the Hong Kong Selection tournament and represented Hong Kong to participate in the Longines Future Tennis Aces Tournament during the French Open at Roland Garros in June.
- The work base of HKTA Development team moved to the HKTA Tennis Centre, Kowloon Tsai.



## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR



- The Hong Kong Junior Davis Cup Team finished 9th out of 16 in the Asia/Oceania Qualifying event in Australia in April.
- The Chickeduck Hong Kong Open Junior Championships 2012 was held in Victoria Park in September. Over 80 Hong Kong and overseas players (18 under) battle for precious world ranking points.
- Katherine Ip gained 8 points and ranked WTA 1016, received a HK\$200,000 prize cheque from the HKTA talented players incentive scheme.
- Jack Wong left the 46th International children's Games (ICG) in Daegu, South Korea with the bronze medal of the Boys' Single and the gold medal of the Boys' Doubles with Lawrence Lo in July.
- Hosted the ITF Pro Circuit Tournament 2012 for consecutive 5 weeks in December 2012 and January 2013.

## REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

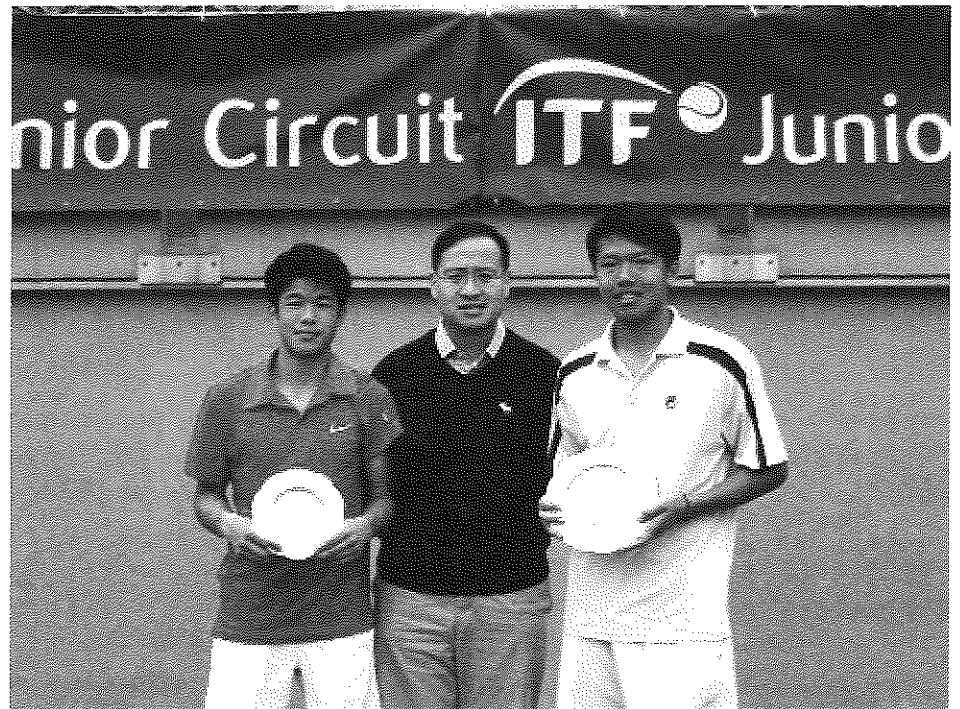
This is my first report to you as President of the Hong Kong Tennis Association. Since I took over the reins of our Association a year ago a great deal has happened, as you can read from the reports of our various committees, but I would like to highlight some of the more important points.

The first major change is that we have decided to hold more high quality international competitions in Hong Kong. In September we held the Chickeeduck Hong Kong Open Junior Championships 2012, which is an ITF Grade 3 Junior Tournament, in Victoria Park. It attracted many top overseas players to Hong Kong. Although the competition was keen, Hong Kong players won the titles of both boys' doubles and girls' doubles.

We also wish to run ITF Grade 1 and Grade 2 Junior Tournaments in Hong Kong in the not too distant future, as we are certain that by organizing such high level tournaments we can give our junior players more opportunities to play against top players from other parts of the world in our own venues. It will also establish Hong Kong as one of the major cities for top junior competitions.

The Council has also decided to hold 3 ITF Men's Circuit Futures Tournaments in December 2012 with a prize money of US\$10,000 for each Tournament. The Futures Tournaments are just one step down from the ATP Challenges Tournaments and with ATP points to be won competition is always very keen. The Tournaments will be held at Victoria Park.

These 3 men's Futures tournaments will be followed by 2 ITF Women's Circuit Futures Tournaments in January 2013 with



similar prize money for each Tournament and WTA points would be awarded.

Mr. Kenneth Tsui, the immediate past president of HKTA lamented in his final report about the demise of professional tennis competition in Hong Kong. I hope he will be pleased to know that we are at an advanced stage of negotiation for the purchase of a WTA International Level Tournament and if successful Hong Kong after a lapse of many years will hold a professional tennis Tournament again in 2014. This will return Hong Kong to the world map of tennis.

Tennis was removed as one of the Elite sports supported by the Hong Kong Sports Institute a few years ago due to the fact that we missed the qualifying standard by one half of an Elite point. In order to get back to being one of the Elite sports, HKTA has been trying very hard to train and produce elite players, especially senior players who can win in professional tournaments or selected international competitions, where the level of competition is remarkably high. HKTA tries to provide the best support to the elite





players in their training and competition, and I am pleased to report that our players are starting to achieve better results. Among the ladies players, Zhang Ling, Venise Chan, Wu Ho Ching and Katherine Ip have obtained their WTA points and among the men players, Brian Yeung and Andy Lau have acquired ATP points. I offer them my congratulations and I sincerely hope they will move up the rankings in the years ahead.

We have not forgotten to maintain our close international relationships. I attended the Annual General Meeting of the ITF in Copenhagen, Denmark and Mr. Michael Cheng, our Hon. Secretary, attended the AGM of ATF in Manila, Philippines. In summer we supported the running of the ITF Level 3 Officials' Course in Hong Kong, and the tutors and officials both praised the excellent choice of Hong Kong as the venue for the course. To support the ATF, we will send a Hong Kong team to compete in the Asian Tennis Championship to be held in Thailand in early December, where Elite points for the HKSI can be won.

In closing, I wish to thank all the dedicated and hardworking Council members and other committee members. Without them the Association's business would grind to a halt.

As the Council is embarking on many innovative projects and ventures, we need the support and co-operation of the staff, and in this regard I do not find them wanting. I therefore offer my heartfelt thanks and appreciation to everyone of the hardworking and conscientious staff.

I also thank all the individual members and the affiliated member clubs of HKTA for their support of the Association throughout the year. I and my fellow Council members never lose sight of the fact that the Association is here to serve them, as well as all other tennis players. I hope they would feel free to communicate with us at any time if they have any questions or suggestions, and I wish them joy in playing the game we all love.

# EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

At the first Council meeting held immediately after the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting in December 2011, it was agreed that all the Chairpersons of the standing committees of the Association should be appointed members of the Executive Committee chaired by the President. Mr Andrew Lee was originally a member of the Coaches Development and Qualifications Committee and the Executive Committee, but he resigned from both Committees in the middle of the year.

During 2012 the following EXCO meetings were held:

- 3 January - At the meeting the appointments of Members and Vice Chairpersons of various Committees were considered and approved. The new designs for the logo, name cards, badges and ties of the Association were discussed. The contracts for the Elite players were also considered. It was also agreed that the re-design of the HKTA Website was to be dealt with by the Membership & Corporate Affairs Committee. The progress on our application to Sir David Trench Fund for renovating the court surface and upgrading the lighting system at the HKTA Tennis Centre in Kowloon Tsai was reported.
- 14 April - The yearly budgets from various Committees were considered and discussed, as the budgets would have to be approved by the Council in May. The adjustment of staff salaries and bonuses were also discussed. The General Manager reported that the application to MLIE for funding the Asian Championship up to a maximum of HK\$800,000 was approved in principle. The proposal to hold 5 Futures tournaments at

the end of the year was considered and approved. The proposal to host a Level 3 ITF Officiating course was also considered and approved.

- 9 June - After dealing with the matters arising from minutes of the previous EXCO meetings, the Committee discussed the purchase of a new computer system for the Association. It was agreed to give the "Cloud" service a try. The design of the sponsorship package for the Futures Series was also discussed. The Committee also considered the possible recruitment of Elite players and the removal of the rights given to the HK Tennis Foundation, the HK Veterans' Tennis Association and the HK Patrons' Association to appoint persons to fill seats in the Council of the Association.





- 11 August - The appointment of Mr. Kevin Kung as a freelance writer for the Association's website was approved and other issues relating to staff were also discussed. A proposal to form an Appeal Panel for the Hong Kong Teams selection as recommended by the ICAC was accepted. An invitation by ITF to host the Davis Cup Group 3 tournament in 2013 was declined.
- 5 September - The proposal for the Association to hold an EGM in October 2012 in order to alter the Articles of Association of HKTA so as to remove the rights of HKTF, HKTVA and HKTF to appoint representatives to sit on the Council of the Association was discussed and agreed. The proposal to run a WTA Event in 2014 was also discussed.
- 10 October - The Committee reviewed the treatment of sponsors at the recent Chickeeduck Hong Kong Open Junior Championship 2012 which was an ITF Grade

3 tournament. It was agreed that there was room for improvement in this regard and the Tournament Committee would consider how improvements could be made. The Committee's attention was drawn to a recommendation by LCSD that all National Sports Associations should require applicants for coaching work to undergo sexual conviction record check with the Police as a basis of assessing their suitability for employment in work with frequent and regular contact with children and mentally incapacitated persons. After discussion the Committee decided to accept the recommendation. The Chairman reported that the ITF jointly with a sports promoter would organize exhibition tennis matches on the first Monday of March in 2013 in Hong Kong, New York and Montreal. The Committee agreed to support the event.



## **OTHER HIGHLIGHTS**

- Our relationship with China and the Chinese Tennis Association is healthy and the yearly Triangular Interport between Jiangmen, Macau and Hong Kong was held this year in Macau. EXCO members together with other members from the Council played in the two day event at the tennis facilities in the Macau Dome. Even though the weather was rainy, a very friendly, though competitive atmosphere prevailed. The Hong Kong team finished second. Next year we will invite Guangzhou to join us and the tournament will take place in that city.
- Many other meetings, events, prize presentations and official dinners were attended by EXCO members during the year and the Chairman Mr. Vincent Liang was also kept very busy attending official functions organised by SF&OC, LCSD and various other bodies in Hong Kong.

## **Terms of Reference**

- i. The Executive Committee is a standing committee of the HKTA Council and is empowered to exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of the Council on any matter within the Council's jurisdiction where decisions have to be made and actions taken between regularly scheduled Council Meetings or where specific responsibilities have from time to time been delegated to the Committee by the Council.
- ii. It will also make decisions within the policies, strategies and agreed budget of the Council, conduct programme evaluation and perform internet audits.
- iii. The Committee will assist in the development of agendas for HKTA Council Meetings and will review recommendations from the President.
- iv. It will make recommendations to the Council on matters of future policy, government and external relations, media policies, conflicts of interest issues, strategic planning, funding and resource allocation, as well as on matters not assigned to other committee.



# MEMBERSHIP & CORPORATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

The Membership & Corporate Affairs Committee (MCAC) continued to act as the medium of communication between the HKTA and its members, affiliated and league clubs, and tennis enthusiasts in the business sector. The latest local tennis news was promptly released through both the HKTA website and the quarterly newsletter.

The Dr. Henry Fok Corporate Patron League celebrated its 20th year during this period and a new format was introduced in which the event was divided into two draws, the Corporate Draw and the Corporate Open Draw. The Corporate Draw was strictly limited to full time employees of the registered corporate teams, whereas the Corporate Open Draw was an open format where the registered corporate sponsored teams had no restrictions on player eligibility. This new format was introduced with the aim of attracting participation from a wider range of organisations to provide higher flexibility on player eligibility. 32 teams and more than 266 players took part in the CPL this year and HKTA received positive feedbacks from many companies and their teams.

Planning for the HKTA website revamp began this year. The aim is to improve the HKTA website and to widen the scope of services that can be provided to members.

Individual and club membership remained steady during the year and generated a stable income for the Association. The surplus of the Dr. Henry Fok Corporate Patron League was over HK\$130,000 which was applied to various HKTA junior development programmes. The HKTA newsletter and official website also created another source of income by offering advertising space to the sponsors.

The major structural change this year saw the coaching qualification matters of the committee moved back to the coaching committee for better coordination. Focusing on academic education and development, the Education and Qualifications Committee (EQC) was renamed the Education and Careers Committee (ECC) to reflect the emphasis of the committee's work.

The objective of HKTA remains first and foremost to develop the best tennis players for Hong Kong. Moreover, only very few have what it takes to become full-time professional tennis players. In years past, we have seen too many top junior tennis players fading out of the sport due to heavy academic pressure. One of the major goals of the ECC is to create a context for tennis and academics to go hand-in-hand so our players can excel in both.

The best way to achieve the above is to ensure that our players and their parents are provided with the most update and accurate information regarding various local and

overseas options for tertiary education. For example, most attendees at our seminar on local university admissions the previous year were not aware that many local universities offer "athletic scholar" programmes that recognise pursuit of sporting excellence as an important attribute in addition to academic results. This year, our focus has shifted to US college admissions.

A US College Admission Seminar was held on 17 March 2012 at the HKTA Tennis Centre in Kowloon Tsai Park to introduce various aspects of playing tennis for a college / university on the US. There were more than 50 players and parents attending the seminar. Committee members Mr. Carter Morris, All-American at Stanford University, and Mr. Andrew Lee, who represented Carnegie Mellon University, introduced the application process and other important matters, such as, college showcase, recruiting, etc. We were also very lucky to have former Wolverine Mr. Brian Hung, who was an All-American ranked as high as No.2 in doubles, come share his experience of playing collegiate tennis at the University of Michigan.

Following our liaison last year with the Hong Kong Education Bureau and the National Collegiate Athletics Association (NCAA), which governs all US college sporting competitions, the NCAA has revised the *Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility* to include the new Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) as a means to satisfy eligibility requirements to play college sports in the US. For a HKDSE student to be eligible, he/she must obtain a pass in five subjects and four of them must be *English, Mathematics, Physical Science and Social Science*. We have further clarified with NCAA that HKDSE core subject *Liberal Studies satisfies the Social Science* requirement.

Back in Hong Kong, there has been a significant rise in interests for our tennis players to pursue a place in local universities. Notable players who have elected to pursue tertiary education in Hong Kong include Tiffany Wu Ho Ching, who is currently enrolled at Hong Kong Polytechnic University and carries a WTA ranking in the 700s. Some local universities are very helpful to athletic scholars and are willing to work out flexible study plans to allow top players can stay "semi-fulltime" to continue to devote much time to training. One of the future goals of this Committee is to work out a more formalised agreement with local universities on such a "semi-fulltime" athletic scholar scheme for tennis players.

Last but not least, I am most grateful to the contributions and enthusiasm of the committee members in the past year.

# PLAYER DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

In 2012, the Player Development Committee (PDC) oversaw the progression of participants in a number of key programmes such as the expansion of the HKTA National Programme and the initiation of a pilot programme for toddlers between the ages of 2-5. With a pathway that allows talented players from a very young age to eventually graduate into the National Programme, numerous players in Hong Kong start looking for a long term and high performance training. This gave the Committee a great deal of pleasure as it shows that there is a bright future ahead for junior player development.

Overall, the HKTA Junior Development Programme continues to be one of the largest and most successful sports developmental programme in Hong Kong. Throughout the year we continued with the programme of promoting mini tennis in kindergartens all over Hong Kong and have seen an increase in the number of kindergartens who have commenced organising training. Plus hundreds of classes organised in the primary schools, more than 800 players in the Junior Tennis Squad Training and the outstanding results of the Elite Development Programme and the Young Athletes Training, it marked the success of the PDC in the year of 2012.

2012 has been a busy but very fruitful year. More than 15 tours for players to train and compete overseas were organised with the players achieving a number of notable results in both local and international events. Based on the Elite Vote points, we had 30 players were awarded HKSI Individual Athletes Scholarships for 2012-2013. They were Zhang Ling, Jonathan Cho, Katherine Ip, Kevin Wong, Brian Yeung, Jasmine Chan, Jeff Chan, Christy Chan, Oscar Cheung, Eudice Chong, Winona Ip, Tommy Lam, Andy Lau, Janet Law, Suki Law, Joyce Leung, Andrew Li, John Li, Lawrence Lo, Claudia Ng, Ng Kwan Yau, Maggie Ng, Robin Nguy, Ronald Pak, Alan Sou, Claire Spackman, Jackie Tang, Jamie Wong, Jack Wong, Yu Wing Sze.

The Elite players continued to make their mark on overseas tournaments. 17-year old Brian Yeung won his first ATP ranking point by defeating world no. 640 Daniel Berta at the US\$10,000 Turkey F7 Futures. He marked a record as the youngest Hong Kong player to possess an ATP Singles ranking. He has a current ATP (Singles) ranking of 1665 and ITF Junior ranking of 121. Another player who has ATP ranking is Andy Lau, who ranked also 1665. For women, we had total 3 players on the WTA ranking list, they are Zhang

Ling (240), Venise Chan (370) and Tiffany Wu (740). At the junior level, we currently have 10 boys and 18 girls on the ITF World Junior Rankings.

At the time of press, retired tennis pro, Philip King, former USTA U18 number1 / with career highest ATP ranking 286 / two time Kalamazoo winner, who now lives in HK, scored his first ATP point as an amateur at the Hong Kong F1 Futures (\$10,000) and got back on to the ATP ranking list. Kevin Kung, former HK top junior, won two matches at the same tournament, scored his first and second ATP point in his tennis career.

The Player Development Committee is pleased to see all the hard work put in throughout the year being rewarded by the large numbers of players who are making good progress in advancing their skills and improving their position on the Player Development Structure.



had also addressed a vision and goals for players in different age groups regarding tournament that they should be playing, which were as follow

Age 14 - to win a ITF group 5 or above

Age 15 - to win a ITF group 4 or above

Age 16 - to win a ITF group 3 or above

Age 17 - to win a ITF group 2 or above

Age 18 - to win a ITF group 1 or above and main draw in 10 k and 15k futures

Players who followed the above rationale would be eligible to reimburse part of their tournament expenses based on the results achieved.

Another incentive to players is to encourage 17-18 years old local junior players to play in ITF Futures. This year, a reward would be given to player who could earned WTA /ATP points during a certain period of time and appear on the WTA/ATP ranking.



## Junior Team Events

In 2012, the selection was based on the Round Robin results which aim to ensure that the selection procedure is well defined and executed in an open and fair way and send the best teams to compete in the events. It was carried out under the close supervision of the Committee.

The Asia/Oceania qualifying for the Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup was held in Victoria, Australia in April. The boys' team of Marco Lam, Ronald Pak and Tommy Lam played well and eventually finished in 9th position. The JFC team of Claire Spackman, Eudice Chong and Maggie Ng finished strong by taking down 7th seed New Zealand and top-seeded India in succession in the positional playoffs to secure 5th overall in the end.

At the WJT Asia/Oceania Final Qualifying in Kuching, the Hong Kong under-14 boys' team of Jack Wong, Jackie Tang and Lawrence Lo claimed sixth place, while the girls' team, Jacinta Chen, Ip Wai Lam, Claudia Ng finished in twelfth position overall.

It has been a successful year for the Player Development Committee and we would like to take this opportunity to express our sincere thanks to the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD), Hong Kong Tennis Foundation (HKTF), Prince, Dunlop, Chickeeduck, Longines, and all the licensed coaches, teachers and players who have rendered so much support to us during the year.

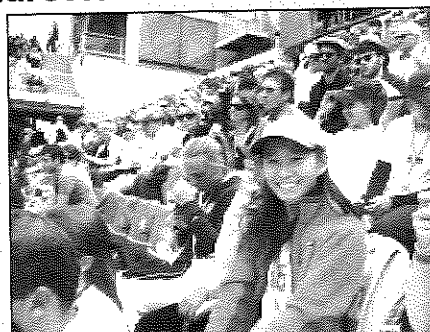
## National Programme

## Elite Development

The Elite Development Programme (ED) was very successful in 2012. There were 200 players continued having training under this high performance programme at Hong Kong Tennis Centre, Causeway Bay, Sai Wan Ho, Shek Ku Lung, Morse Park, Yuen Long, Tuen Mun and North District. In order to provide a clearer pathway for their development and show how players progress through the groups, the group names were changed to start with the ball colour that they were using for training, e.g. Yellow 1, Green 1, Orange 1 and Red 1.



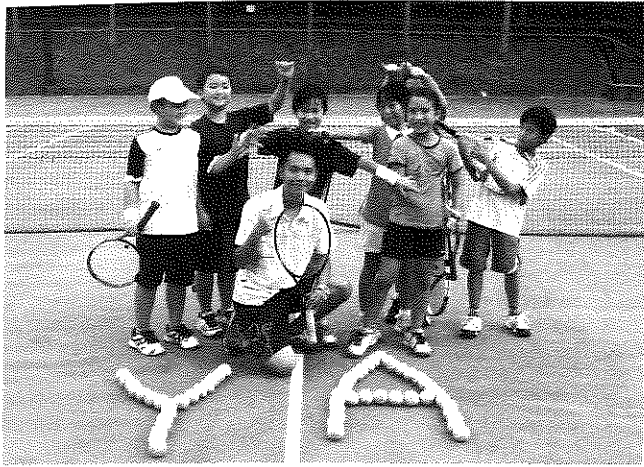
Throughout the year, apart from training, camps and tours were organised during long holidays which aims to develop players' touring and independent skills. Touring is great fun and a great learning experience for players who wish to pursue tennis as a profession and be constantly travelling around the world.

The Committee will continue to work hard in 2013 to explore avenues for improving the effectiveness of training and we are looking forward to seeing our juniors from ED programme, succeeding into the National Squad.

## Junior Tennis Squad

With more than 800 players in the programme, the Junior Tennis Squad was an important channel for the growth of a broad base of tennis-playing youngsters in Hong Kong and serve as a major channel through which talents are identified and promoted to join the training at higher levels.





In 2012, the total number of squads was seventy-six and organised at 26 venues, players have undergone systematic training all over Hong Kong, Kowloon and the New Territories; they are supervised by a group of experienced HKTA licensed coaches. At the end of the season, a Squad meet was organised and it consists of a parent seminar, fitness workshop and a presentation.

### Young Athletes Training Programm

With the introduction of Tennis 10s from the ITF and in order to standardize the balls that were using in the programme, the target had changed to 10 and under and the training was using Green balls. Apart from it, the Committee had also assigned one more advanced coach to monitor the programme and focus on players' technical development throughout the year.

The open assessments were held every 6 months and it was conducted by a selection panel. The panel would ensure that those with "champion potential" are spotted and evaluations were conducted regularly to make sure the players were given a progressive pathway to developing their true potential in the game. Apart from that, players also need to fulfill the requirements set, like attendance and tournament commitment.

### HK Tennis Stars of the Future 2012

The programme has for years attracted thousands of newcomers to the game of tennis. In 2012 summer, there

were approximate 850 fresh new faces have picked up a tennis racquet for the first time, all of whom will hopefully, in time, learn to appreciate the time-honoured virtues of tennis and come to embrace it as "a sport for life".

The programme is well structured with five stages to provide a systematic tennis training programme at the entry-level for kids between the ages of 6-14. As the participants advance to a higher stage, their skill level and knowledge of the game will also increase correspondingly. The programme finally highlighted with an age-group competition, which was a chance for the players and coaches to see how they have advanced after 6 months of training. Those who exhibit a keen talent for the game may also receive invitations to join various HKTA junior squads to further their development.

With the support of LONGINES, the winners of the U8, B10, G10, B12, G14, B14 and first runner-up of U8 were awarded with the LONGINES Future Tennis Aces Scholarships to support their further training. They were Cheung Kei Yau, Choi Tak Ching, Fung Ho Yeung, Max Kwok, Kwok Oi Laam, Lee Ka Ka, Lee Sze Yin Christy and Jonathan Tu.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank LONGINES, Dunlop, Ocean Potion and LCSD. In the future, we are looking forward to meet more younger kids to discover their sporting potential and experience the fun of tennis through this programme.

### Mini-Tennis

The overall Mini Tennis Programme, which includes Primary School Mini Tennis, Regional Mini Tennis, and Kindergarten Mini Tennis Tour, has







proven to be an invaluable and enjoyable starting point for children looking to pick up tennis as an extra-curricular activity. In 2012, a pilot programme for toddlers between the ages of 2-5 was launched. This programme aims at bringing kids into the game by utilizing specialized equipment, shorter court, dimensions, and other teaching aids, all tailored to the children's age and size.

### Primary School Mini Tennis

With the generous sponsorship of Prince and the Hong Kong Tennis Foundation, the HKTA/Prince Mini Tennis Promotion Scheme is now in its 21st year. During this time, over 10,000 primary school students have benefited from this programme.



The Scheme consists of 4 components: namely School Visits, Teachers' Training, District Inter-schools Competition and the Annual Championships. The 2011/12 Scheme has continued to receive overwhelming response, 55 Primary Schools have entered the Scheme and 444 juniors played for their schools in the Mini Tennis District Inter-Schools Competitions. As a continuation programme of the Prince Mini Tennis Promotion, twenty-four aged 9 and under players were invited to participate in the Summer Camp, Joint School Sports Training Programme and Young Athlete Training Scheme.

### Regional Mini Tennis

As well as the HKTA/Prince Mini Promotion Scheme we currently have thousands of students who are receiving or have received mini-tennis training under the Schools Sports Programme that is jointly run by the HKTA and the LCSD. We also organise the Regional Mini Tennis Training Programme which provides mini-tennis classes at different levels to help the children attain good results. In the past summer, training was organised in more venues which successfully attracting additional two hundred 6 and under players start the game. As well as the aforementioned programmes we



also operate family mini tennis classes during weekends allowing parents to participate together with their young children and give them guidance on how to enjoy playing and hopefully choose tennis as their "sport for life". During 2012, the participation number continues to grow and we are looking for a more successful year in 2013 by adding more fun elements in the programme.

### Kindergarten Mini Tennis Tour

This year, the Mini Tennis Demonstration work continues. The HKTA has contacted many kindergartens to arrange a fun and inter-active mini tennis day for those young children aged 5 and under at their schools. The response of the children has been great and the principals and teachers appreciated very much the extra values that have been brought to their school life by playing mini tennis. The Mini Tennis Demo Team will continue to work hard and visit more kindergartens and put rackets into the hands of the enthusiastic young children in the coming year.

### Tennis-For-All

The meaning of "Tennis-for-all" is all embracing and remains as one of the most popular open enrolment programme. Many people immediately think of this programme when they want to learn and improve their tennis skills as some 100 tennis classes are open bi-monthly at different public courts for both beginners and experienced players to develop hand/eye coordination, techniques and motor skills

that are required to play good tennis. In order to broaden the programme, we have started to organise training in non-peak hours, e.g. morning tennis as well as different promotions aimed to attract more people to play during their leisure time. In 2012 approximately 500 classes have been organised bi-monthly and they are professionally conducted by the HKTA Licensed Coaches.

### HKTA Corporate Tennis Training Scheme

In addition to providing tennis training programmes at the community level, the HKTA also caters to the corporate sector in Hong Kong. This scheme offers tailor-made and budget-priced tennis courses for players of all ability levels, all taught by HKTA-licensed coaches. Corporations have the option of choosing their preferred time slot and venue, and the scheme's flexibility and cost effectiveness make it an ideal sporting activity for the hectic lifestyles of today's business executives.

### Community Tennis

The LCSD, the FCTC and the HKTA have been working in partnership to increase participation across all sectors to fulfill our task of broadening the base of tennis participation in the territory.

This year, we continued to explore channels to promote community participation in tennis, and find ways to foster partnerships with different sectors for the promotion of community sports. We have been working with schools, the district offices and non-government organisations in the community, in order to promote tennis-related activities and create a sustainable sporting culture in Hong Kong.

In the CSC programme, a total of 35 community tennis clubs are affiliated with the HKTA, the highest number of community clubs amongst all sports in Hong Kong. In collaboration with the LCSD, the HKTA also promote various tennis initiatives to the tennis community such as tennis fun days and a Coach Licensing Scheme through the network of Community Tennis Clubs. It is our hope that by increasing the opportunities for community tennis to flourish, the overall tennis population will also grow and more people can benefit from the game.

# COACHES DEVELOPMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

With a view to ensure quality of coaching in Hong Kong, the Coaches Development Committee (CDC) has evolved to become the Coaches Development and Qualifications Committee (CDQC) in 2012. The CDQC continues to provide learning opportunities for coaches including organizing training courses, supporting young coaches to attend overseas conference.

The CDQC also works on promoting the Coach Licensing Scheme in order to uphold the overall standard of all coaches working under the HKTA umbrella. By the end of November 2012, 353 licensed coaches are registered under the Scheme.

## Continuous Professional Development Programme

The “Continuous Professional Development Programme” plays an important role in developing coaches in Hong Kong. In 2012, various experts have been invited to share their experience and knowledge in tennis, sports science and physical fitness with our coaches. The topics mainly focused on scientific coaching methodologies, specific training plans for players at different stages, as well as the application of sports science in areas of physical strengthening and sports injury.

The 12 workshops and seminars organized have provided a golden opportunity for licensed coaches to consolidate their knowledge in scientific aspect. The workshops and seminars are very well received by our coaches. Below is a table summarizing the workshops and seminars organized in 2012.

### 16th ITF Asian Regional Coaches Conference in Bangkok, Thailand

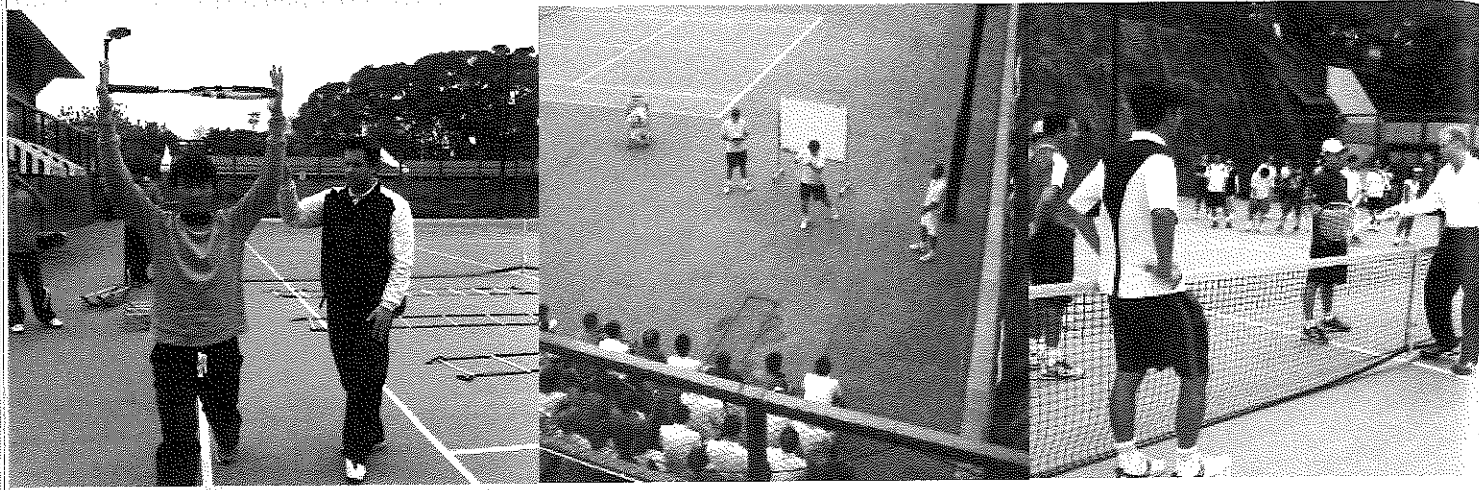
This year, the Biannual ITF Regional Coaches Conference was held from 7th to 10th November in Bangkok, Thailand. Connecting with the World and obtaining the latest knowledge in tennis development has always been the CDQC's goal. With the Hong Kong Coaching Committee's support, the CDQC has sent three young coaches to the Conference namely, Mr. CHEUNG Man Chun, Mr. CHEUNG King Kwok and Mr. YIP Ting Hang. Apart from learning the latest coaching methods at the Conference, the three local coaches had the opportunity to share and exchange their knowledge with over 160 coaches from 24 countries.

### ITF Endorsed HKTA Coach Certification Scheme

In view of the need for quality coaches and a growing demand for certified tennis coaches, the HKTA collaborated with the ITF and launched the Certification Scheme in Hong Kong in 2003. Over the years, one Advanced Coach Course, 11 Development Coach Courses, 34 Elementary Coach Courses, 32 Mini Tennis Instructor Courses and 16 Pre-courses have been organized. In 2012, over 150 candidates have undergone this Certification Scheme. In 2013, we have planned to organize one Advanced Coach Course, one Development Course, two Elementary Coach Courses and two Mini Tennis Instructor Courses for interested tennis lovers to learn to be a coach.







## HKTA Coach Licensing Scheme and Coach Benefits

Initiated by the EQC in 2003, the HKTA Coach Licensing Scheme serves to provide a quality benchmark for accessing the overall standard of coaches. The Scheme helps to fulfill the market demand for standardization and recognition towards coaches' qualification, and opens a learning window for the coaches to keep abreast of the latest coaching know-how and technology in the game of tennis through a continuous educational programme. In 2012, 169 out of 220 license holders gained the prerequisite credit points and have successfully renewed their licenses for another two years, representing a 76.8% successful renewal rate and representing a total of 357 licensed coaches registered as of 28 October, 2012.

Later, the Scheme has become the policy of the LCSD that any new tennis coaches who wish to register with them for community tennis programmes must possess a HKTA license. This arrangement has shown the strong commitment of the HKTA in safeguarding the teaching quality of coaches in Hong Kong.

The CDQC has been actively promoting the status of the HKTA licensed coaches in all of the HKTA programmes and on public courts throughout the year. The CDQC places a great deal of focus on the benefits for the licensed coaches

and has endeavored to promote the licensed coach status to the tennis public. The CDQC has been liaising with potential sponsors with a view to provide tailor-made services and benefits for licensed coaches including discount purchase of equipment and receiving sports physiotherapy services at a special rate.

The CDQC also has established an effective communication channel for disseminating useful information from the ITF, HKSI and the LCSD. In 2012, the Committee has launched a bi-monthly coaching electronic newsletter to all licensed coaches. This arrangement ensures that the coaches can be updated with the latest news in coach education and government policies, regarding training, facilities and programme management.

The CDQC is very concerned about the potential liability that our licensed coaches may shoulder during tennis coaching. A third party liability insurance policy is thus purchased to cover all licensed coaches who are coaching on tennis courts all over Hong Kong. There are currently approximately 370 licensed coaches that are covered by this policy. A briefing session has been arranged in early 2013 for all licensed coaches on detail of the policy.

The HKTA Coaches' Library, located at the HKTA Tennis Centre at Kowloon Tsai Park, provides another platform for the continual development and upgrading of coaches

in Hong Kong. The library contains latest collections of essential publications, DVDs and videotapes from the ITF and well-established tennis academies. Licensed coaches are encouraged to fully utilize the valuable resources in the library in order to keep them abreast of the latest coaching knowledge.

As the Chairman of the CDQC, I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to the immediate past Chairman, Committee Members and speakers for their unfailing support and contribution in the development of coaches in Hong Kong.

# TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

With competition being one of the key elements in the sport of tennis the Tournament Committee (TC) is committed to provide tournaments at all levels and for all ages. Tennis is a sport that is played for life and the competitive element of tournaments is one way of keeping players in the game. Tournaments can be arranged for any age group; for juniors as young as 5 years of age to senior players up to 70 years, our aims are therefore to organise even more tournaments for players of all levels and ages. This year Hong Kong has organized 3 Men's 10K Futures in December 2012 and 2 Women's Circuits and on the first 2 weeks of January 2013 at Victoria Park.

An important duty of the Committee is the selection of teams from eligible and available players to represent Hong Kong in all major games and representative competitions, tournament results and rankings being one of the means of selection.

To ensure that the younger players can gain match experience at an early age many competitions are organised with the aim of attracting the younger players. By promoting the Novice Competitions for beginners and the Junior Series with Boys and Girls Grade 1 to 4 events for the more experienced players, we have successfully increased the numbers playing in both series. This year the tournament section has been very busy, with a 5% increase in entries for the National Junior Championships, and a 6% increase in the Junior Series this gave an impressive average of 570 entries for each competition with the youngest player in the Junior Novice Competition being only 6 years of age. The Committee also organised four mini tennis competitions for

children aged 8 and under, these competitions are intended to give them a starting point in their tennis competitive careers. In November 2012, this is second year we co-organised the All HK Inter-Primary School Competition with the School Sports Federation, this tournament involved 70 participating schools.

This year the Committee is promoting the ITF "Tennis 10s" for the Junior Novice Competition the aged 10 and under event using Green Ball and aged 8 and 9 using Orange Ball with small size of court.



## Community Tennis

The community tennis events are an integral and popular part of the tournament scene in Hong Kong and each year tennis events are organised in all the different districts to enable players of all standards to compete. This year the Committee has co-organised with the Federation of Community Tennis Clubs on aged 12 and under tournaments for the juniors in different district areas. In 2012 thousands of local players enjoyed participating in the Federation of Community Tennis Clubs League and the Hong Kong Districts Tennis Circuit.

## ITF Junior Circuit Tournaments (Grade 3 and Grade 4)

For over twenty years the HKTA has run International Tennis Federation (ITF) Junior Circuit Tournaments in Hong Kong. This year the TC organised one Grade 4 event in January and one Grade 3 event in October, which was upgraded by the ITF from Grade 4 to Grade 3, and juniors from 16 countries travelled to Hong Kong to participate in the popular world ranking events. These tournaments are a unique opportunity for our top 18 and under local players to experience playing against some of the best juniors in the world and enjoy the advantage of playing in a home environment. For many of the local players it is their first taste of international play and it gives them a valuable insight into the high standards of the juniors around the world. It also helps them to gain their first ITF Junior World ranking, or improve their current rankings. At the end of November 2012 Hong Kong had a record 11 boys and 18 girls with a world junior ranking.

## HK National Tennis Championships

The Hong Kong National Tennis Championships is one of the three major tennis tournaments that are held annually in Hong Kong, the other two being the SCAA Open and the CRC Open and most of the top players in Hong Kong compete in these three events. Nine events were played: Men's and Ladies' Singles and Doubles, Men's and Ladies' B Singles and Doubles and Mixed Doubles.

## Lions Hong Kong National Junior Tennis Championships

The Hong Kong National Junior Tennis Championships was once again sponsored by Lions Clubs International District 303 Hong Kong & Macau. The very popular event was held from 30 January to 3 March at Victoria Park. The juniors competed in 14 events: Boys' and Girls' Singles 10U, 12U, 14U, 18U and Boys' and Girls' Doubles 12U, 14U, 18U and we saw a record entry of 780 players.

## Rankings

Results from the National Championships, the SCAA Open, the CRC Open, and the Hong Kong Districts Tennis Circuit, as well as conversion points from ITF Junior ranking tournaments, WTA, ATP and ITF Futures events are used for the HKTA National Rankings. All participants in these tournaments will have a Numeric Ranking starting from number one. The Junior National Ranking system shows Singles rankings for Boys and Girls 10&U, 12&U, 14&U, 18&U as well as Boys' and Girls' Doubles rankings 12&U, 14&U, 18&U.

## International Exposure

Teams from Hong Kong compete each year in ITF Team Competitions and it is the duty of the Committee to ensure that there is a fair selection procedure for these events. This year players, captains and managers were selected for: the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas, the Fed Cup by BNP Paribas, and the National Inter-Cities Games. Many of Hong Kong's elite junior players also travelled overseas during the year to compete in ITF international junior team competitions - the Asia/Oceania qualifying for the under-14s World Junior Tennis Competition for both boys and girls, the Junior Davis Cup (boys), and the Junior Fed Cup (girls) for under-16 juniors.

# OFFICIATING COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

It was a busy year for the HKTA officials, 66 events in Hong Kong were covered by the local chair, roving and line umpires. These events included the ITF Men's Futures, the Women Circuits, the Davis Cup, the two ITF international junior tournaments, the three major local tournaments – the Hong Kong National Tennis Championships, the SCAA Open and the CRC Open – and numerous corporate, district, junior tournaments, competitions and leagues. Some of our senior officials had the opportunity to work tournaments at the International level in ITF, WTA and ATP events, these events included the Federation Cup and the Shanghai ATP Masters 1000.

The Officiating Committee strive to focus on improving the standard of officiating at all levels and encourage more officials to attend ITF workshops to upgrade their officiating levels, and get further experience by working at international events. The Committee is currently concentrating on three main development areas in an attempt to improve the officiating levels in Hong Kong:-

- Officials Education Programmes
- Players and parents education
- Setting officiating policies and initiatives

The Committee has taken the active step to improving knowledge and rules of the game promoting the "Rules of Tennis" to as many tennis groups in Hong Kong as possible. On 31 October, a seminar was organized for the LCSD staffs, a part of contents were about the Rules of Tennis. The Committee shall continue to organise more seminars to all walks of the tennis community in the Hong Kong Tennis.

Seminars, lectures, refresher's course and training sessions have been organized throughout the year at different levels to ensure our officials maintained a high and sharp level of competence. Various team building event were organized including hosting the annual dinner for the officials with a view to promoting teamwork; and to giving the officials an opportunity to get together at a social level away from the tournament scene.

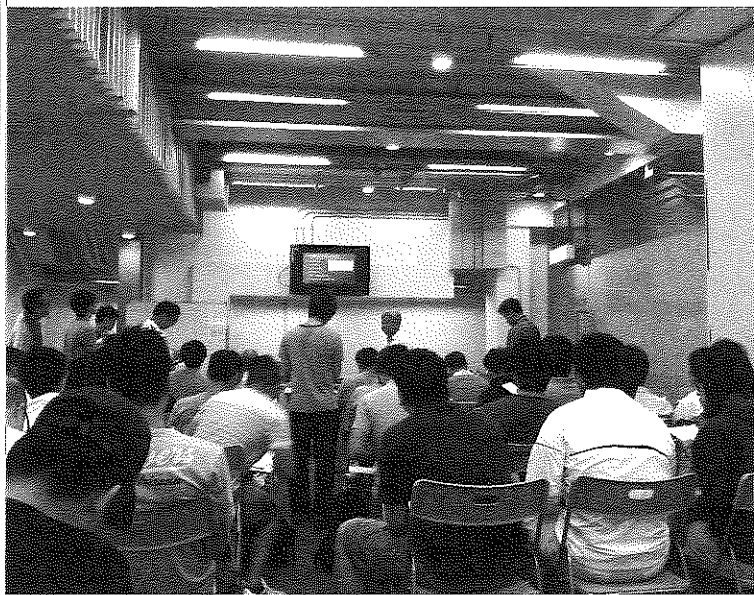

Communication and creating awareness of the works of the officials are the strategic developmental projects undertaken by the committee. A dedicated officials section will be set up on the HKTA website for both the officials and also for the public to enable them to understand the "Rules of Tennis" and the work of the Committee. Starting this year HKTA newsletter also covers an officiating section, with the aim of providing updated information on related topics and the sharing of experiences for both officials and casual readers.

An Event Disciplinary Policy was implemented this year, the policy is to preserve the image and integrity of tennis in Hong Kong and to promote sportsman-like conduct in all events to which this Policy applies. This Policy provides the framework for dealing with event related breaches of discipline in a consistent manner. The committee shall continue to review the effectiveness of disciplinary framework and policy environment and assess the need to make changes as appropriate to uphold the integrity of the sport in Hong Kong.

ITF Level 3 Officiating School was held in Hong Kong from 7 to 10 October 2012 at Olympic House Hong Kong, there were 22 candidates that attended the course from overseas and in Hong Kong. The Committee is proud to be involved



in supporting the International Tennis Federation in holding a senior officiating course in Hong Kong. The committee hope to build on the experience to host more international officiating courses in Hong Kong.

# LEAGUE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

## Year in Review

The HKTA Tennis League is traditionally one of the most popular and arguably the longest running team event in the city having two years ago celebrated its 100 years in operation. Many of the original clubs that participated still do so to this day and the league continues to grow with more teams each year. Every year during the various league seasons over 3,100 persons old and young now actively participate.

In 2012, 41 member clubs and league clubs, 171 teams and more than 3,100 players took part in the various divisions, the actual total registration of players over all the leagues was 12,020. The youngest player in the leagues is 6 years old, a participant in the Junior League and there are players in their late 70s perhaps even into their 80s still playing league tennis. The two major leagues that are held each year are the Summer and Winter Leagues. In addition to these, a Mixed Doubles League, a Veterans League (run jointly with Hong Kong Veterans Tennis Association), a Two Court League (run together with the Federation of Community Tennis Clubs (FCTC)) and a Junior League also take place over the course of 12 months.

The HKTA is constantly searching for opportunities that will allow more clubs and players to participate in league tennis. One initiative is the Winter Two-Court league. This league is becoming more popular each year with an additional 8 teams that have joined since 2009. It is jointly organised by the HKTA and the FCTC and is aimed at providing league tennis to all community tennis clubs and residential tennis clubs in Hong Kong. The target is those clubs and complexes

### Terms of Reference
